Throughout this policy the words "you" and "your" refer to the Named Insured shown in the Declarations, and any other person or organization qualifying as a Named Insured under this policy. The words "we", "us" and "our" refer to the company providing this insurance.

The word "insured" means any person or organization qualifying as such under Section II - Who Is An Insured.

Other words and phrases that appear in quotation marks have special meaning. Refer to Section **V** -Definitions.

SECTION I - COVERAGES

COVERAGE A - BODILY INJURY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE LIABILITY

1. Insuring Agreement

- **a.** We will pay on behalf of the insured the "ultimate net loss" in excess of the "retained limit" because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance applies. We will have the right and duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for such "bodily injury" or "property damage" when the "underlying insurance" does not provide coverage or the limits of "underlying insurance" have been exhausted. When we have no duty to defend, we will have the right to defend, or to participate in the defense of, the insured against any other "suit" seeking damages to which this insurance may apply. However, we will have no duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this insurance does not apply. At our discretion, we may investigate any "occurrence" that may involve this insurance and settle any resultant claim or "suit" for which we have the duty to defend. But:
 - (1) The amount we will pay for the "ultimate net loss" is limited as described in Section III -Limits Of Insurance; and
 - (2) Our right and duty to defend ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements under Coverages **A** or **B**.

No other obligation or liability to pay sums or perform acts or services is covered unless explicitly provided for under Supplementary Payments -Coverages **A** and **B**.

- b. This insurance applies to "bodily injury" or "property damage" that is subject to an applicable "retained limit". If any other limit, such as a sublimit, is specified in the "underlying insurance", this insurance does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of that exposure unless that limit is specified in the Declarations under the Schedule of "underlying insurance".
- **c.** This insurance applies to "bodily injury" and "property damage" only if:
 - The "bodily injury" or "property damage" is caused by an "occurrence" that takes place in the "coverage territory";
 - (2) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs during the policy period; and
 - (3) Prior to the policy period, no insured listed under Paragraph 1.a. of Section II - Who Is An Insured and no "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim, knew that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" had occurred, in whole or in part. If such a listed insured or authorized "employee" knew, prior to the policy period, that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurred, then any continuation, change or resumption of such "bodily injury" or "property damage" during or after the policy period will be deemed to have been known prior to the policy period.
- d. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which occurs during the policy period and was not, prior to the policy period, known to have occurred by any insured listed under Paragraph 1.a. of Section II -Who Is An Insured or any "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim, includes any continuation, change or resumption of that "bodily injury" or "property damage" after the end of the policy period.

- e. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" will be deemed to have been known to have occurred at the earliest time when any insured listed under Paragraph 1.a. of Section II Who Is An Insured or any "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim:
 - (1) Reports all, or any part, of the "bodily injury" or "property damage" to us or any other insurer;
 - (2) Receives a written or verbal demand or claim for damages because of the "bodily injury" or "property damage"; or
 - (3) Becomes aware by any other means that "bodily injury" or "property damage" has occurred or has begun to occur.
- f. Damages because of "bodily injury" include damages claimed by any person or organization for care, loss of services or death resulting at any time from the "bodily injury".

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

a. Expected Or Intended Injury

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" expected or intended from the standpoint of the insured. This exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" resulting from the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property.

b. Contractual Liability

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which the insured is obligated to pay damages by reason of the assumption of liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages:

- (1) That the insured would have in the absence of the contract or agreement; or
- (2) Assumed in a contract or agreement that is an "insured contract", provided the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs subsequent to the execution of the contract or agreement. Solely for the purposes of liability assumed in an "insured contract", reasonable attorneys' fees and necessary litigation expenses incurred by or for a party other than an insured are deemed to be damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage", provided:
 - (a) Liability to such party for, or for the cost of, that party's defense has also been assumed in the same "insured contract"; and

(b) Such attorneys' fees and litigation expenses are for defense of that party against a civil or alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which damages to which this insurance applies are alleged.

c. Liquor Liability

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which any insured may be held liable by reason of:

- (1) Causing or contributing to the intoxication of any person;
- (2) The furnishing of alcoholic beverages to a person under the legal drinking age or under the influence of alcohol; or
- (3) Any statute, ordinance or regulation relating to the sale, gift, distribution or use of alcoholic beverages.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in:

- (a) The supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured; or
- (b) Providing or failing to provide transportation with respect to any person that may be under the influence of alcohol;

if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage" involved that which is described in Paragraph (1), (2) or (3) above.

However, this exclusion applies only if you are in the business of manufacturing, distributing, selling, serving or furnishing alcoholic beverages. For the purposes of this exclusion, permitting a person to bring alcoholic beverages on your premises, for consumption on your premises, whether or not a fee is charged or a license is required for such activity, is not by itself considered the business of selling, serving or furnishing alcoholic beverages.

This exclusion does not apply to the extent that valid "underlying insurance" for the liquor liability risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury" and "property damage". To the extent this exclusion does not apply, the insurance provided under this Coverage Part for the liquor liability risks described above will follow the same provisions, exclusions and limitations that are contained in the applicable "underlying insurance", unless otherwise directed by this insurance.

d. Workers' Compensation And Similar Laws

Any obligation of the insured under a workers' compensation, disability benefits or unemployment compensation law or any similar law.

e. ERISA

Any obligation of the insured under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), and any amendments thereto or any similar federal, state or local statute.

f. Auto Coverages

- (1) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of any "auto" which is not a "covered auto"; or
- (2) Any loss, cost or expense payable under or resulting from any first-party physical damage coverage; no-fault law; personal injury protection or auto medical payments coverage; or uninsured or underinsured motorist law.

g. Employer's Liability

"Bodily injury" to:

- (1) An "employee" of the insured arising out of and in the course of:
 - (a) Employment by the insured; or
 - (b) Performing duties related to the conduct of the insured's business; or
- (2) The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph (1) above.

This exclusion applies whether the insured may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity, and to any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

This exclusion does not apply to liability assumed by the insured under an "insured contract".

With respect to injury arising out of a "covered auto", this exclusion does not apply to "bodily injury" to domestic "employees" not entitled to workers' compensation benefits. For the purposes of this insurance, a domestic "employee" is a person engaged in household or domestic work performed principally in connection with a residence premises. This exclusion does not apply to the extent that valid "underlying insurance" for the employer's liability risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury". To the extent this exclusion does not apply, the insurance provided under this Coverage Part for the employer's liability risks described above will follow the same provisions, exclusions and limitations that are contained in the applicable "underlying insurance", unless otherwise directed by this insurance.

h. Employment-related Practices

"Bodily injury" to:

- (1) A person arising out of any:
 - (a) Refusal to employ that person;
 - (b) Termination of that person's employment; or
 - (c) Employment-related practices, policies, acts or omissions, such as coercion, demotion, evaluation, reassignment, discipline, defamation, harassment, humiliation, discrimination or malicious prosecution directed at that person; or
- (2) The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that person as a consequence of "bodily injury" to that person at whom any of the employment-related practices described in Paragraph (a), (b), or (c) above is directed.

This exclusion applies whether the injury- causing event described in Paragraph (a), (b) or (c) above occurs before employment, during employment or after employment of that person.

This exclusion applies whether the insured may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity, and to any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

- i. Pollution
 - (1) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which would not have occurred in whole or part but for the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "pollutants" at any time; or

This exclusion does not apply if valid "underlying insurance" for the pollution liability risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury" and "property damage". To the extent this exclusion does not apply, the insurance provided under this Coverage Part for the pollution risks described above will follow the same provisions, exclusions and limitations that are contained in the applicable "underlying insurance", unless otherwise directed by this insurance.

j. Aircraft Or Watercraft

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the ownership, maintenance, use or entrustment to others of any aircraft or watercraft owned or operated by or rented or loaned to any insured. Use includes operation and "loading or unloading".

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured, if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage" involved the ownership, maintenance, use or entrustment to others of any aircraft or watercraft that is owned or operated by or rented or loaned to any insured.

This exclusion does not apply to:

- (1) A watercraft while ashore on premises you own or rent;
- (2) A watercraft you do not own that is:
 - (a) Less than 50 feet long; and
 - (b) Not being used to carry persons or property for a charge;
- (3) Liability assumed under any "insured contract" for the ownership, maintenance or use of aircraft or watercraft;
- (4) The extent that valid "underlying insurance" for the aircraft or watercraft liability risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury" or "property damage". To the extent this exclusion does not apply, the insurance provided under this Coverage Part for the aircraft or watercraft risks described above will follow the same provisions, exclusions and limitations that are contained in the "underlying insurance", unless otherwise directed by this insurance; or

- (5) Aircraft that is:
 - (a) Chartered by, loaned to, or hired by you with a paid crew; and
 - (b) Not owned by any insured.

k. Racing Activities

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the use of "mobile equipment" or "autos" in, or while in practice for, or while being prepared for, any prearranged professional or organized racing, speed, demolition, or stunting activity or contest.

I. War

"Bodily injury" or "property damage", however caused, arising, directly or indirectly, out of:

- (1) War, including undeclared or civil war;
- (2) Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, sovereign or other authority using military personnel or other agents; or
- (3) Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power, or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or defending against any of these.

m. Damage To Property

"Property damage" to:

- (1) Property:
 - (a) You own, rent, or occupy, including any costs or expenses incurred by you, or any other person, organization or entity, for repair, replacement, enhancement, restoration or maintenance of such property for any reason, including prevention of injury to a person or damage to another's property; or
 - (b) Owned or transported by the insured and arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of a "covered auto".
- (2) Premises you sell, give away or abandon, if the "property damage" arises out of any part of those premises;
- (3) Property loaned to you;
- (4) Personal property in the care, custody or control of the insured;
- (5) That particular part of real property on which you or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on your behalf are performing operations, if the "property damage" arises out of those operations; or

(6) That particular part of any property that must be restored, repaired or replaced because "your work" was incorrectly performed on it.

Paragraph (2) of this exclusion does not apply if the premises are "your work" and were never occupied, rented or held for rental by you.

Paragraphs (1)(b), (3), (4), (5) and (6) of this exclusion do not apply to liability assumed under a sidetrack agreement.

Paragraphs (3) and (4) of this exclusion do not apply to liability assumed under a written Trailer Interchange agreement.

Paragraph **(6)** of this exclusion does not apply to "property damage" included in the "products-completed operations hazard".

n. Damage To Your Product

"Property damage" to "your product" arising out of it or any part of it.

o. Damage To Your Work

"Property damage" to "your work" arising out of it or any part of it and included in the "products-completed operations hazard".

This exclusion does not apply if the damaged work or the work out of which the damage arises was performed on your behalf by a subcontractor.

p. Damage To Impaired Property Or Property Not Physically Injured

"Property damage" to "impaired property" or property that has not been physically injured, arising out of:

- (1) A defect, deficiency, inadequacy or dangerous condition in "your product" or "your work"; or
- (2) A delay or failure by you or anyone acting on your behalf to perform a contract or agreement in accordance with its terms.

This exclusion does not apply to the loss of use of other property arising out of sudden and accidental physical injury to "your product" or "your work" after it has been put to its intended use.

q. Recall Of Products, Work Or Impaired Property

Damages claimed for any loss, cost or expense incurred by you or others for the loss of use, withdrawal, recall, inspection, repair, replacement, adjustment, removal or disposal of:

- (1) "Your product";
- (2) "Your work"; or

(3) "Impaired property";

if such product, work, or property is withdrawn or recalled from the market or from use by any person or organization because of a known or suspected defect, deficiency, inadequacy or dangerous condition in it.

r. Personal And Advertising Injury

"Bodily injury" arising out of "personal and advertising injury".

s. Professional Services

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" due to rendering of or failure to render any professional service. This includes but is not limited to:

- (1) Legal, accounting or advertising services;
- (2) Preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve, maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings or specifications;
- (3) Inspection, supervision, quality control, architectural or engineering activities done by or for you on a project on which you serve as construction manager;
- (4) Engineering services, including related supervisory or inspection services;
- (5) Medical, surgical, dental, X-ray or nursing services treatment, advice or instruction;
- (6) Any health or therapeutic service treatment, advice or instruction;
- (7) Any service, treatment, advice or instruction for the purpose of appearance or skin enhancement, hair removal or replacement, or personal grooming or therapy;
- (8) Any service, treatment, advice or instruction relating to physical fitness, including service, treatment, advice or instruction in connection with diet, cardiovascular fitness, bodybuilding or physical training programs;
- (9) Optometry or optical or hearing aid services including the prescribing, preparation, fitting, demonstration or distribution of ophthalmic lenses and similar products or hearing aid devices;
- (10) Body piercing services;
- (11) Services in the practice of pharmacy;
- (12) Law enforcement or firefighting services; and
- (13) Handling, embalming, disposal, burial, cremation or disinterment of dead bodies.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured, if the "occurrence" which caused the "bodily injury" or "property damage", involved the rendering of or failure to render any professional service.

t. Electronic Data

Damages arising out of the loss of, loss of use of, damage to, corruption of, inability to access or inability to manipulate electronic data.

However, this exclusion does not apply to liability for damages because of "bodily injury".

As used in this exclusion, electronic data means information, facts or programs stored as or on, created or used on, or transmitted to or from computer software, including systems and applications software, hard or floppy disks, CD-ROMs, tapes, drives, cells, data processing devices or any other media which are used with electronically controlled equipment.

This exclusion does not apply if valid "underlying insurance" for the electronic data risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury" and "property damage". The insurance provided under this Coverage Part will follow the same provisions, exclusions and limitations that are contained in the applicable "underlying insurance", unless otherwise directed by this insurance.

u. Recording And Distribution Of Material Or Information In Violation Of Law

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising directly or indirectly out of any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate:

- (1) The Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA), including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (2) The CAN-SPAM Act of 2003, including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (3) The Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), and any amendment of or addition to such law, including the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA); or
- (4) Any federal, state or local statute, ordinance or regulation, other than the TCPA, CAN-SPAM Act of 2003 or FCRA and their amendments and additions, that addresses, prohibits, or limits the printing, dissemination, disposal, collecting, recording, sending, transmitting, communicating or distribution of material or information.

COVERAGE B - PERSONAL AND ADVERTISING INJURY LIABILITY

1. Insuring Agreement

- a. We will pay on behalf of the insured the "ultimate net loss" in excess of the "retained limit" because of "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance applies. We will have the right and duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for such "personal and advertising injury" when the "underlying insurance" does not provide coverage or the limits of "underlying insurance" have been exhausted. When we have no duty to defend, we will have the right to defend, or to participate in the defense of, the insured against any other "suit" seeking damages to which this insurance may apply. However, we will have no duty to defend the insured against any "suit" seeking damages for "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance does not apply. At our discretion, we may investigate any offense that may involve this insurance and settle any resultant claim or "suit" for which we have the duty to defend. But:
 - (1) The amount we will pay for the "ultimate net loss" is limited as described in Section III -Limits Of Insurance; and
 - (2) Our right and duty to defend end when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements under Coverages **A** or **B**.

No other obligation or liability to pay sums or perform acts or services is covered unless explicitly provided for under Supplementary Payments -Coverages **A** and **B**.

- **b.** This insurance applies to "personal and advertising injury" that is subject to an applicable "retained limit". If any other limit, such as a sublimit, is specified in the "underlying insurance", this insurance does not apply to "personal and advertising injury" arising out of that exposure unless that limit is specified in the Declarations under the Schedule of "underlying insurance".
- **c.** This insurance applies to "personal and advertising injury" caused by an offense arising out of your business but only if the offense was committed in the "coverage territory" during the policy period.

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

a. "Personal and advertising injury":

(1) Knowing Violation Of Rights Of Another

Caused by or at the direction of the insured with the knowledge that the act would violate the rights of another and would inflict "personal and advertising injury".

(2) Material Published With Knowledge Of Falsity

Arising out of oral or written publication, in any manner, of material, if done by or at the direction of the insured with knowledge of its falsity.

(3) Material Published Prior To Policy Period

Arising out of oral or written publication, in any manner, of material whose first publication took place before the beginning of the policy period.

(4) Criminal Acts

Arising out of a criminal act committed by or at the direction of the insured.

(5) Contractual Liability

For which the insured has assumed liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to:

- (a) Liability for damages that the insured would have in the absence of the contract or agreement.
- (b) Liability for false arrest, detention or imprisonment assumed in a contract or agreement.

(6) Breach Of Contract

Arising out of a breach of contract, except an implied contract to use another's advertising idea in your "advertisement".

(7) Quality Or Performance Of Goods - Failure To Conform To Statements

Arising out of the failure of goods, products or services to conform with any statement of quality or performance made in your "advertisement".

(8) Wrong Description Of Prices

Arising out of the wrong description of the price of goods, products or services stated in your "advertisement".

(9) Infringement Of Copyright, Patent, Trademark Or Trade Secret

Arising out of the infringement of copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret or other intellectual property rights. Under this exclusion, such other intellectual property rights do not include the use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement".

However, this exclusion does not apply to infringement, in your "advertisement", of copyright, trade dress or slogan.

(10) Insureds In Media And Internet Type Businesses

Committed by an insured whose business is:

- (a) Advertising, broadcasting, publishing or telecasting;
- (b) Designing or determining content of web sites for others; or
- (c) An Internet search, access, content or service provider.

However, this exclusion does not apply to Paragraphs **14.a.**, **b.** and **c.** of "personal and advertising injury" under the Definitions section.

For the purposes of this exclusion, the placing of frames, borders or links, or advertising, for you or others anywhere on the Internet, is not by itself, considered the business of advertising, broadcasting, publishing or telecasting.

(11) Electronic Chatrooms Or Bulletin Boards

Arising out of an electronic chatroom or bulletin board the insured hosts, owns, or over which the insured exercises control.

(12) Unauthorized Use Of Another's Name Or Product

Arising out of the unauthorized use of another's name or product in your e-mail address, domain name or metatag, or any other similar tactics to mislead another's potential customers.

(13) Pollution

Arising out of the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "pollutants" at any time.

(14) Employment-related Practices

To:

- (a) A person arising out of any:
 - (i) Refusal to employ that person;
 - (ii) Termination of that person's employment; or
 - (iii) Employment-related practices, policies, acts or omissions, such as coercion, demotion, evaluation, reassignment, discipline, defamation, harassment, humiliation, discrimination or malicious prosecution directed at that person; or
- (b) The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that person as a consequence of "personal and advertising injury" to that person at whom any of the employment-related practices described in Paragraph (i), (ii) or (iii) above is directed.

This exclusion applies whether the injurycausing event described in Paragraph (i), (ii) or (iii) above occurs before employment, during employment or after employment of that person.

This exclusion applies whether the insured may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity, and to any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

(15) Professional Services

Arising out of the rendering of or failure to render any professional service. This includes but is not limited to:

- (a) Legal, accounting or advertising services;
- (b) Preparing, approving, or failing to prepare or approve, maps, shop drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, field orders, change orders or drawings or specifications;
- (c) Inspection, supervision, quality control, architectural or engineering activities done by or for you on a project on which you serve as construction manager;
- (d) Engineering services, including related supervisory or inspection services;
- (e) Medical, surgical, dental, X-ray or nursing services treatment, advice or instruction;

- (f) Any health or therapeutic service treatment, advice or instruction;
- (g) Any service, treatment, advice or instruction for the purpose of appearance or skin enhancement, hair removal or replacement, or personal grooming or therapy;
- (h) Any service, treatment, advice or instruction relating to physical fitness, including service, treatment, advice or instruction in connection with diet, cardiovascular fitness, bodybuilding or physical training programs;
- (i) Optometry or optical or hearing aid services including the prescribing, preparation, fitting, demonstration or distribution of ophthalmic lenses and similar products or hearing aid devices;
- (j) Body piercing services;
- (k) Services in the practice of pharmacy;
- (I) Law enforcement or firefighting services; and
- (m) Handling, embalming, disposal, burial, cremation or disinterment of dead bodies.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others by that insured, if the offense which caused the "personal and advertising injury", involved the rendering of or failure to render any professional service.

(16) War

However caused, arising, directly or indirectly, out of:

- (a) War, including undeclared or civil war;
- (b) Warlike action by a military force, including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected attack, by any government, sovereign or other authority using military personnel or other agents; or
- (c) Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, usurped power, or action taken by governmental authority in hindering or defending against any of these.

(17) Recording And Distribution Of Material Or Information In Violation Of Law

Arising directly or indirectly out of any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate:

- (a) The Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA), including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (b) The CAN-SPAM Act of 2003, including any amendment of or addition to such law;
- (c) The Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA), and any amendment of or addition to such law, including the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA); or
- (d) Any federal, state or local statute, ordinance or regulation, other than the TCPA, CAN-SPAM Act of 2003 or FCRA and their amendments and additions, that addresses, prohibits. or limits the printing, dissemination, disposal, collecting, recording, sending, transmitting, communicating or distribution of material or information.
- b. "Pollution cost or expense".

SUPPLEMENTARY PAYMENTS - COVERAGES A AND B

- 1. We will pay, with respect to any claim we investigate or settle, or any "suit" against an insured we defend, when the duty to defend exists:
 - a. All expenses we incur.
 - **b.** Up to \$2,000 for cost of bail bonds (including bonds for related traffic law violations) required because of an "occurrence" we cover. We do not have to furnish these bonds.
 - **c.** The cost of bonds to release attachments, but only for bond amounts within the applicable limit of insurance. We do not have to furnish these bonds.
 - **d.** All reasonable expenses incurred by the insured at our request to assist us in the investigation or defense of the claim or "suit", including actual loss of earnings up to \$250 a day because of time off from work.
 - e. All court costs taxed against the insured in the "suit". However, these payments do not include attorneys' fees or attorneys' expenses taxed against the insured.

- **f.** Prejudgment interest awarded against the insured on that part of the judgment we pay. If we make an offer to pay the applicable limit of insurance, we will not pay any prejudgment interest based on that period of time after the offer.
- **g.** All interest on the full amount of any judgment that accrues after entry of the judgment and before we have paid, offered to pay, or deposited in court the part of the judgment that is within the applicable limit of insurance.

These payments will not reduce the limits of insurance.

- 2. When we have the right but not the duty to defend the insured and elect to participate in the defense, we will pay our own expenses but will not contribute to the expenses of the insured or the "underlying insurer".
- **3.** If we defend an insured against a "suit" and an indemnitee of the insured is also named as a party to the "suit", we will defend that indemnitee if all of the following conditions are met:
 - **a.** The "suit" against the indemnitee seeks damages for which the insured has assumed the liability of the indemnitee in a contract or agreement that is an "insured contract";
 - **b.** This insurance applies to such liability assumed by the insured;
 - c. The obligation to defend, or the cost of the defense of, that indemnitee, has also been assumed by the insured in the same "insured contract";
 - **d.** The allegations in the "suit" and the information we know about the "occurrence" are such that no conflict appears to exist between the interests of the insured and the interests of the indemnitee;
 - e. The indemnitee and the insured ask us to conduct and control the defense of that indemnitee against such "suit" and agree that we can assign the same counsel to defend the insured and the indemnitee; and
 - f. The indemnitee:
 - (1) Agrees in writing to:
 - (a) Cooperate with us in the investigation, settlement or defense of the "suit";
 - (b) Immediately send us copies of any demands, notices, summonses or legal papers received in connection with the "suit";
 - (c) Notify any other insurer whose coverage is available to the indemnitee; and

- (d) Cooperate with us with respect to coordinating other applicable insurance available to the indemnitee; and
- (2) Provides us with written authorization to:
 - (a) Obtain records and other information related to the "suit"; and
 - (b) Conduct and control the defense of the indemnitee in such "suit".

So long as the above conditions are met, attorneys' fees incurred by us in the defense of that indemnitee, necessary litigation expenses incurred by us and necessary litigation expenses incurred by the indemnitee at our request will be paid as Supplementary Payments. Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph **2.b.(2)** of Section **I** - Coverage **A** - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability, such payments will not be deemed to be damages for "bodily injury" and "property damage" and will not reduce the limits of insurance.

Our obligation to defend an insured's indemnitee and to pay for attorneys' fees and necessary litigation expenses as Supplementary Payments ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of judgments or settlements or the conditions set forth above, or the terms of the agreement described in Paragraph **f**. above, are no longer met.

SECTION II - WHO IS AN INSURED

- **1.** Except for liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of "covered autos":
 - **a.** If you are designated in the Declarations as:
 - (1) An individual, you and your spouse are insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of a business of which you are the sole owner.
 - (2) A partnership or joint venture, you are an insured. Your members, your partners, and their spouses are also insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of your business.
 - (3) A limited liability company, you are an insured. Your members are also insureds, but only with respect to the conduct of your business. Your managers are insureds, but only with respect to their duties as your managers.
 - (4) An organization other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company, you are an insured. Your "executive officers" and directors are insureds, but only with respect to their duties as your officers or directors. Your stockholders are also insureds, but only with respect to their liability as stockholders.

- (5) A trust, you are an insured. Your trustees are also insureds, but only with respect to their duties as trustees.
- **b.** Each of the following is also an insured:
 - (1) Your "volunteer workers" only while performing duties related to the conduct of your business, or your "employees", other than either your "executive officers" (if you are an organization other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company) or your managers (if you are a limited liability company), but only for acts within the scope of their employment by you or while performing duties related to the conduct of your business. However, none of these "employees" or "volunteer workers" are insureds for:
 - (a) "Bodily injury" or "personal and advertising injury":
 - (i) To you, to your partners or members (if you are a partnership or joint venture), to your members (if you are a limited liability company), to a co-"employee" in the course of his or her employment or performing duties related to the conduct of your business or to your other "volunteer workers" while performing duties related to the conduct of your business;
 - (ii) To the spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that co-"employee" or "volunteer worker" as a consequence of Paragraph (a)(i) above; or
 - (iii) For which there is any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury described in Paragraph (a)(i) or (ii) above.
 - (b) "Property damage" to property:
 - (i) Owned, occupied or used by;
 - (ii) Rented to, in the care, custody or control of, or over which physical control is being exercised for any purpose by;

you, any of your "employees", "volunteer workers", any partner or member (if you are a partnership or joint venture), or any member (if you are a limited liability company).

(2) Any person (other than your "employee" or "volunteer worker"), or any organization while acting as your real estate manager.

- (3) Any person or organization having proper temporary custody of your property if you die, but only:
 - (a) With respect to liability arising out of the maintenance or use of that property; and
 - (b) Until your legal representative has been appointed.
- (4) Your legal representative if you die, but only with respect to duties as such. That representative will have all your rights and duties under this Coverage Part.
- **c.** Any organization you newly acquire or form, other than a partnership, joint venture or limited liability company, and over which you maintain ownership or majority interest, will qualify as a Named Insured if there is no other similar insurance available to that organization. However:
 - (1) Coverage under this provision is afforded only until the 90th day after you acquire or form the organization or the end of the policy period, whichever is earlier;
 - (2) Coverage A does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization; and
 - (3) Coverage **B** does not apply to "personal and advertising injury" arising out of an offense committed before you acquired or formed the organization.
- **2.** Only with respect to liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of "covered autos":
 - **a.** You are an insured.
 - **b.** Anyone else while using with your permission a "covered auto" you own, hire or borrow is also an insured except:
 - (1) The owner or anyone else from whom you hire or borrow a "covered auto". This exception does not apply if the "covered auto" is a trailer or semitrailer connected to a "covered auto" you own.
 - (2) Your "employee" if the "covered auto" is owned by that "employee" or a member of his or her household.
 - (3) Someone using a "covered auto" while he or she is working in a business of selling, servicing, repairing, parking or storing "autos" unless that business is yours.

- (4) Anyone other than your "employees", partners (if you are a partnership), members (if you are a limited liability company), or a lessee or borrower or any of their "employees", while moving property to or from a "covered auto".
- (5) A partner (if you are a partnership), or a member (if you are a limited liability company) for a "covered auto" owned by him or her or a member of his or her household.
- (6) "Employees" with respect to "bodily injury" to:
 - (a) Any fellow "employee" of the insured arising out of and in the course of the fellow "employee's" employment or while performing duties related to the conduct of your business; or
 - (b) The spouse, child, parent, brother or sister of that fellow "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph (a) above.
- **c.** Anyone liable for the conduct of an insured described above is also an insured, but only to the extent of that liability.
- **3.** Any additional insured under any policy of "underlying insurance" will automatically be an insured under this insurance.

Subject to Section **III** - Limits Of Insurance, if coverage provided to the additional insured is required by a contract or agreement, the most we will pay on behalf of the additional insured is the amount of insurance:

- **a.** Required by the contract or agreement, less any amounts payable by any "underlying insurance"; or
- **b.** Available under the applicable Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations;

whichever is less.

Additional insured coverage provided by this insurance will not be broader than coverage provided by the "underlying insurance".

No person or organization is an insured with respect to the conduct of any current or past partnership, joint venture or limited liability company that is not shown as a Named Insured in the Declarations.

SECTION III - LIMITS OF INSURANCE

- 1. The Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations and the rules below fix the most we will pay regardless of the number of:
 - a. Insureds;
 - **b.** Claims made, "suits" brought, or number of vehicles involved; or
 - c. Persons or organizations making claims or bringing "suits".
- **2.** The Aggregate Limit is the most we will pay for the sum of all "ultimate net loss" under:
 - a. Coverage A, except "ultimate net loss" because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of a "covered auto"; and
 - **b.** Coverage **B.**
- Subject to Paragraph 2. above, the Each Occurrence Limit is the most we will pay for the sum of all "ultimate net loss" under Coverage A because of all "bodily injury" and "property damage" arising out of any one "occurrence".
- Subject to Paragraph 2. above, the Personal And Advertising Injury Limit is the most we will pay under Coverage B for the sum of all "ultimate net loss" because of all "personal and advertising injury" sustained by any one person or organization.
- **5.** If there is "underlying insurance" with a policy period that is nonconcurrent with the policy period of this Commercial Liability Umbrella Coverage Part, the "retained limit(s)" will only be reduced or exhausted by payments for:
 - **a.** "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which occurs during the policy period of this Coverage Part; or
 - **b.** "Personal and advertising injury" for offenses that are committed during the policy period of this Coverage Part.

However, if any "underlying insurance" is written on a claims-made basis, the "retained limit(s)" will only be reduced or exhausted by claims for that insurance that are made during the policy period, or any Extended Reporting Period, of this Coverage Part.

The Aggregate Limit, as described in Paragraph **2**. above, applies separately to each consecutive annual period and to any remaining period of less than 12 months, starting with the beginning of the policy period shown in the Declarations, unless the policy period is extended after issuance for an additional period of less than 12 months. In that case, the additional period will be deemed part of the last preceding period for purposes of determining the Limits of Insurance.

SECTION IV - CONDITIONS

1. Appeals

If the "underlying insurer" or insured elects not to appeal a judgment in excess of the "retained limit", we may do so at our own expense. We will also pay for taxable court costs, pre- and postjudgment interest and disbursements associated with such appeal. In no event will this provision increase our liability beyond the applicable Limits of Insurance described in Section **III** -Limits Of Insurance.

2. Bankruptcy

a. Bankruptcy Of Insured

Bankruptcy or insolvency of the insured or of the insured's estate will not relieve us of our obligations under this Coverage Part.

b. Bankruptcy Of Underlying Insurer

Bankruptcy or insolvency of the "underlying insurer" will not relieve us of our obligations under this Coverage Part.

However, this insurance will not replace the "underlying insurance" in the event of bankruptcy or insolvency of the "underlying insurer". This insurance will apply as if the "underlying insurance" were in full effect.

3. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Offense, Claim Or Suit

- a. You must see to it that we are notified as soon as practicable of an "occurrence" or an offense, regardless of the amount, which may result in a claim. To the extent possible, notice should include:
 - (1) How, when and where the "occurrence" or offense took place;
 - (2) The names and addresses of any injured persons and witnesses; and
 - (3) The nature and location of any injury or damage arising out of the "occurrence" or offense.
- **b.** If a claim is made or "suit" is brought against any insured, you must:
 - (1) Immediately record the specifics of the claim or "suit" and the date received; and
 - (2) Notify us as soon as practicable.

You must see to it that we receive written notice of the claim or "suit" as soon as practicable.

- c. You and any other involved insured must:
 - Immediately send us copies of any demands, notices, summonses or legal papers received in connection with the claim or "suit";

- (2) Authorize us to obtain records and other information;
- (3) Cooperate with us in the investigation or settlement of the claim or defense against the "suit"; and
- (4) Assist us, upon our request, in the enforcement of any right against any person or organization which may be liable to the insured because of injury or damage to which this insurance may also apply.
- **d.** No insured will, except at that insured's own cost, voluntarily make a payment, assume any obligation, or incur any expense, other than for first aid, without our consent.

4. Legal Action Against Us

No person or organization has a right under this Coverage Part:

- **a.** To join us as a party or otherwise bring us into a "suit" asking for damages from an insured; or
- **b.** To sue us on this Coverage Part unless all of its terms have been fully complied with.

A person or organization may sue us to recover on an agreed settlement or on a final judgment against an insured; but we will not be liable for damages that are not payable under the terms of this Coverage Part or that are in excess of the applicable limit of insurance. An agreed settlement means a settlement and release of liability signed by us, the insured and the claimant or the claimant's legal representative.

5. Other Insurance

a. This insurance is excess over, and shall not contribute with any of the other insurance, whether primary, excess, contingent or on any other basis. This condition will not apply to insurance specifically written as excess over this Coverage Part.

When this insurance is excess, we will have no duty under Coverages **A** or **B** to defend the insured against any "suit" if any other insurer has a duty to defend the insured against that "suit". If no other insurer defends, we will undertake to do so, but we will be entitled to the insured's rights against all those other insurers.

- **b.** When this insurance is excess over other insurance, we will pay only our share of the "ultimate net loss" that exceeds the sum of:
 - (1) The total amount that all such other insurance would pay for the loss in the absence of the insurance provided under this Coverage Part; and

(2) The total of all deductible and self-insured amounts under all that other insurance.

6. Premium Audit

- **a.** We will compute all premiums for this Coverage Part in accordance with our rules and rates.
- **b.** Premium shown in this Coverage Part as advance premium is a deposit premium only. At the close of each audit period we will compute the earned premium for that period and send notice to the first Named Insured. The due date for audit and retrospective premiums is the date shown as the due date on the bill. If the sum of the advance and audit premiums paid for the policy period is greater than the earned premium, we will return the excess to the first Named Insured.
- **c.** The first Named Insured must keep records of the information we need for premium computation, and send us copies at such times as we may request.

7. Representations Or Fraud

By accepting this policy, you agree:

- **a.** The statements in the Declarations are accurate and complete;
- **b.** Those statements are based upon representations you made to us;
- **c.** We have issued this policy in reliance upon your representations; and
- **d.** This policy is void in any case of fraud by you as it relates to this policy or any claim under this policy.

8. Separation Of Insureds

Except with respect to the Limits of Insurance, and any rights or duties specifically assigned in this Coverage Part to the first Named Insured, this insurance applies:

- **a.** As if each Named Insured were the only Named Insured; and
- **b.** Separately to each insured against whom claim is made or "suit" is brought.

9. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us

If the insured has rights to recover all or part of any payment we have made under this Coverage Part, those rights are transferred to us. The insured must do nothing after loss to impair them. At our request, the insured will bring "suit" or transfer those rights to us and help us enforce them.

10. When We Do Not Renew

If we decide not to renew this Coverage Part, we will mail or deliver to the first Named Insured shown in the Declarations written notice of the nonrenewal not less than 30 days before the expiration date.

If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

11. Loss Payable

Liability under this Coverage Part does not apply to a given claim unless and until:

- **a.** The insured or insured's "underlying insurer" has become obligated to pay the "retained limit"; and
- **b.** The obligation of the insured to pay the "ultimate net loss" in excess of the "retained limit" has been determined by a final settlement or judgment or written agreement among the insured, claimant and us.

12. Transfer Of Defense

When the underlying limits of insurance have been used up in the payment of judgments or settlements, the duty to defend will be transferred to us. We will cooperate in the transfer of control to us of any outstanding claims or "suits" seeking damages to which this insurance applies which would have been covered by the "underlying insurance" had the applicable limit not been used up.

13. Maintenance Of/Changes To Underlying Insurance

Any "underlying insurance" must be maintained in full effect without reduction of coverage or limits except for the reduction of the aggregate limit in accordance with the provisions of such "underlying insurance" that results from payment of claims, settlement or judgments to which this insurance applies.

Such exhaustion or reduction is not a failure to maintain "underlying insurance". Failure to maintain "underlying insurance" will not invalidate insurance provided under this Coverage Part, but insurance provided under this Coverage Part will apply as if the "underlying insurance" were in full effect.

If there is an increase in the scope of coverage of any "underlying insurance" during the term of this policy, our liability will be no more than it would have been if there had been no such increase.

You must notify us in writing, as soon as practicable, if any "underlying insurance" is cancelled, not renewed, replaced or otherwise terminated, or if the limits or scope of coverage of any "underlying insurance" is changed.

14. Expanded Coverage Territory

a. If a "suit" is brought in a part of the "coverage territory" that is outside the United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Puerto Rico or Canada, and we are prevented by law, or otherwise, from defending the insured, the insured will initiate a defense of the "suit". We will reimburse the insured, under Supplementary Payments, for any reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for the defense of a "suit" seeking damages to which this insurance applies, that we would have paid had we been able to exercise our right and duty to defend.

If the insured becomes legally obligated to pay sums because of damages to which this insurance applies in a part of the "coverage territory" that is outside the United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Puerto Rico or Canada, and we are prevented by law, or otherwise, from paying such sums on the insured's behalf, we will reimburse the insured for such sums.

- **b.** All payments or reimbursements we make for damages because of judgments or settlements will be made in U.S. currency at the prevailing exchange rate at the time the insured became legally obligated to pay such sums. All payments or reimbursements we make for expenses under Supplementary Payments will be made in U.S. currency at the prevailing exchange rate at the time the expenses were incurred.
- **c.** Any disputes between you and us as to whether there is coverage under this policy must be filed in the courts of the United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Canada or Puerto Rico.
- **d.** The insured must fully maintain any coverage required by law, regulation or other governmental authority during the policy period, except for reduction of the aggregate limits due to payments of claims, judgments or settlements.

Failure to maintain such coverage required by law, regulation or other governmental authority will not invalidate this insurance. However, this insurance will apply as if the required coverage by law, regulation or other governmental authority was in full effect.

SECTION V - DEFINITIONS

- 1. "Advertisement" means a notice that is broadcast or published to the general public or specific market segments about your goods, products or services for the purpose of attracting customers or supporters. For the purposes of this definition:
 - **a.** Notices that are published include material placed on the Internet or on similar electronic means of communication; and
 - **b.** Regarding web sites, only that part of a web site that is about your goods, products or services for the purposes of attracting customers or supporters is considered an advertisement.
- 2. "Auto" means:
 - **a.** A land motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer designed for travel on public roads, including any attached machinery or equipment; or
 - **b.** Any other land vehicle that is subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged.

However, "auto" does not include "mobile equipment".

- **3.** "Bodily injury" means bodily injury, disability, sickness or disease sustained by a person, including death resulting from any of these at any time. "Bodily injury" includes mental anguish or other mental injury resulting from "bodily injury".
- **4.** "Coverage territory" means anywhere in the world with the exception of any country or jurisdiction which is subject to trade or other economic sanction or embargo by the United States of America.
- **5.** "Covered auto" means only those "autos" to which "underlying insurance" applies.
- **6.** "Employee" includes a "leased worker". "Employee" does not include a "temporary worker".
- **7.** "Executive officer" means a person holding any of the officer positions created by your charter, constitution, bylaws or any other similar governing document.
- **8.** "Impaired property" means tangible property, other than "your product" or "your work", that cannot be used or is less useful because:
 - **a.** It incorporates "your product" or "your work" that is known or thought to be defective, deficient, inadequate or dangerous; or
 - **b.** You have failed to fulfill the terms of a contract or agreement;

if such property can be restored to use by the repair, replacement, adjustment or removal of "your product" or "your work", or your fulfilling the terms of the contract or agreement.

- **9.** "Insured contract" means:
 - **a.** A contract for a lease of premises. However, that portion of the contract for a lease of premises that indemnifies any person or organization for damage by fire to premises while rented to you or temporarily occupied by you with permission of the owner is not an "insured contract";
 - **b.** A sidetrack agreement;
 - **c.** Any easement or license agreement, except in connection with construction or demolition operations on or within 50 feet of a railroad;
 - **d.** An obligation, as required by ordinance, to indemnify a municipality, except in connection with work for a municipality;
 - e. An elevator maintenance agreement;
 - f. That part of any contract or agreement entered into, as part of your business, pertaining to the rental or lease, by you or any of your "employees", of any "auto". However, such contract or agreement shall not be considered an "insured contract" to the extent that it obligates you or any of your "employees" to pay for "property damage" to any "auto" rented or leased by you or any of your "employees".
 - **g.** That part of any other contract or agreement pertaining to your business (including an indemnification of a municipality in connection with work performed for a municipality) under which you assume the tort liability of another party to pay for "bodily injury" or "property damage" to a third person or organization. Tort liability means a liability that would be imposed by law in the absence of any contract or agreement.

Paragraphs **f.** and **g.** do not include that part of any contract or agreement:

- (1) That indemnifies a railroad for "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of construction or demolition operations, within 50 feet of any railroad property and affecting any railroad bridge or trestle, tracks, road-beds, tunnel, underpass or crossing;
- (2) That pertains to the loan, lease or rental of an "auto" to you or any of your "employees", if the "auto" is loaned, leased or rented with a driver; or

- (3) That holds a person or organization engaged in the business of transporting property by "auto" for hire harmless for your use of a "covered auto" over a route or territory that person or organization is authorized to serve by public authority.
- **10.** "Leased worker" means a person leased to you by a labor leasing firm under an agreement between you and the labor leasing firm, to perform duties related to the conduct of your business. "Leased worker" does not include a "temporary worker".
- **11.**"Loading or unloading" means the handling of property:
 - After it is moved from the place where it is accepted for movement into or onto an aircraft, watercraft or "auto";
 - While it is in or on an aircraft, watercraft or "auto"; or
 - **c.** While it is being moved from an aircraft, watercraft or "auto" to the place where it is finally delivered;

but "loading or unloading" does not include the movement of property by means of a mechanical device, other than a hand truck, that is not attached to the aircraft, watercraft or "auto".

- **12.** "Mobile equipment" means any of the following types of land vehicles, including any attached machinery or equipment:
 - Bulldozers, farm machinery, forklifts and other vehicles designed for use principally off public roads;
 - **b.** Vehicles maintained for use solely on or next to premises you own or rent;
 - c. Vehicles that travel on crawler treads;
 - **d.** Vehicles, whether self-propelled or not, maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently mounted:
 - (1) Power cranes, shovels, loaders, diggers or drills; or
 - (2) Road construction or resurfacing equipment such as graders, scrapers or rollers;
 - e. Vehicles not described in Paragraph a., b., c. or d. above that are not self-propelled and are maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently attached equipment of the following types:
 - (1) Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting and well servicing equipment; or
 - (2) Cherry pickers and similar devices used to raise or lower workers;

f. Vehicles not described in Paragraph **a.**, **b.**, **c.** or **d.** above maintained primarily for purposes other than the transportation of persons or cargo.

However, self-propelled vehicles with the following types of permanently attached equipment are not "mobile equipment" but will be considered "autos":

- (1) Equipment designed primarily for:
 - (a) Snow removal;
 - (b) Road maintenance, but not construction or resurfacing; or
 - (c) Street cleaning;
- (2) Cherry pickers and similar devices mounted on automobile or truck chassis and used to raise or lower workers; and
- (3) Air compressors, pumps and generators, including spraying, welding, building cleaning, geophysical exploration, lighting and well servicing equipment.

However, "mobile equipment" does not include land vehicles that are subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law where it is licensed or principally garaged. Land vehicles subject to a compulsory or financial responsibility law or other motor vehicle insurance law are considered "autos".

- **13.** "Occurrence" means an accident, including continuous or repeated exposure to substantially the same general harmful conditions.
- **14.** "Personal and advertising injury" means injury, including consequential "bodily injury", arising out of one or more of the following offenses:
 - a. False arrest, detention or imprisonment;
 - **b.** Malicious prosecution;
 - **c.** The wrongful eviction from, wrongful entry into, or invasion of the right of private occupancy of a room, dwelling or premises that a person occupies, committed by or on behalf of its owner, landlord or lessor;
 - d. Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that slanders or libels a person or organization or disparages a person's or organization's goods, products or services;
 - e. Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that violates a person's right of privacy;
 - f. The use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement"; or
 - **g.** Infringing upon another's copyright, trade dress or slogan in your "advertisement".

- **15.** "Pollutants" mean any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, including smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, acids, alkalis, chemicals and waste. Waste includes materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reclaimed.
- **16.**"Pollution cost or expense" means any loss, cost or expense arising out of any:
 - a. Request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any insured or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants"; or
 - b. Claim or suit by or on behalf of a governmental authority for damages because of testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying or neutralizing, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "pollutants".
- 17. "Products-completed operations hazard":
 - **a.** Includes all "bodily injury" and "property damage" occurring away from premises you own or rent and arising out of "your product" or "your work" except:
 - (1) Products that are still in your physical possession; or
 - (2) Work that has not yet been completed or abandoned. However, "your work" will be deemed completed at the earliest of the following times:
 - (a) When all of the work called for in your contract has been completed.
 - (b) When all of the work to be done at the job site has been completed if your contract calls for work at more than one job site.
 - (c) When that part of the work done at a job site has been put to its intended use by any person or organization other than another contractor or subcontractor working on the same project.

Work that may need service, maintenance, correction, repair or replacement, but which is otherwise complete, will be treated as completed.

- **b.** Does not include "bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of:
 - (1) The transportation of property, unless the injury or damage arises out of a condition in or on a vehicle not owned or operated by you, and that condition was created by the "loading or unloading" of that vehicle by any insured; or

- (2) The existence of tools, uninstalled equipment or abandoned or unused materials.
- 18. "Property damage" means:
 - a. Physical injury to tangible property, including all resulting loss of use of that property. All such loss of use shall be deemed to occur at the time of the physical injury that caused it; or
 - **b.** Loss of use of tangible property that is not physically injured. All such loss of use shall be deemed to occur at the time of the "occurrence" that caused it.

With respect to the ownership, maintenance or use of "covered autos", property damage also includes "pollution cost or expense", but only to the extent that coverage exists under the "underlying insurance" or would have existed but for the exhaustion of the underlying limits.

For the purposes of this insurance, with respect to other than the ownership, maintenance or use of "covered autos", electronic data is not tangible property.

As used in this definition, electronic data means information, facts or programs stored as or on, created or used on, or transmitted to or from computer software (including systems and applications software), hard or floppy disks, CD-ROMs, tapes, drives, cells, data processing devices or any other media which are used with electronically controlled equipment.

- **19.**"Retained limit" means the available limits of "underlying insurance" scheduled in the Declarations or the "self-insured retention", whichever applies.
- **20.** "Self-insured retention" means the dollar amount listed in the Declarations that will be paid by the insured before this insurance becomes applicable only with respect to "occurrences" or offenses not covered by the "underlying insurance". The "self-insured retention" does not apply to "occurrences" or offenses which would have been covered by "underlying insurance" but for the exhaustion of applicable limits.
- **21.**"Suit" means a civil proceeding in which damages because of "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" to which this insurance applies are alleged. "Suit" includes:
 - **a.** An arbitration proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured must submit or does submit with our consent; or

- **b.** Any other alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured submits with our consent or the "underlying insurer's" consent.
- **22.** "Temporary worker" means a person who is furnished to you to substitute for a permanent "employee" on leave or to meet seasonal or short-term workload conditions.
- **23.** "Ultimate net loss" means the total sum, after reduction for recoveries or salvages collectible, that the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages by reason of settlement or judgments or any arbitration or other alternate dispute method entered into with our consent or the "underlying insurer's" consent.
- **24.** "Underlying insurance" means any policies of insurance listed in the Declarations under the Schedule of "underlying insurance".
- **25.** "Underlying insurer" means any insurer who provides any policy of insurance listed in the Schedule of "underlying insurance".
- **26.** "Volunteer worker" means a person who is not your "employee", and who donates his or her work and acts at the direction of and within the scope of duties determined by you, and is not paid a fee, salary or other compensation by you or anyone else for their work performed for you.
- 27. "Your product":
 - a. Means:
 - (1) Any goods or products, other than real property, manufactured, sold, handled, distributed or disposed of by:
 - (a) You;
 - (b) Others trading under your name; or
 - (c) A person or organization whose business or assets you have acquired; and
 - (2) Containers (other than vehicles), materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such goods or products.

- b. Includes:
 - (1) Warranties or representations made at any time with respect to the fitness, quality, durability, performance or use of "your product"; and
 - (2) The providing of or failure to provide warnings or instructions.
- **c.** Does not include vending machines or other property rented to or located for the use of others but not sold.
- 28. "Your work":
 - a. Means:
 - (1) Work or operations performed by you or on your behalf; and
 - (2) Materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.
 - **b.** Includes:
 - (1) Warranties or representations made at any time with respect to the fitness, quality, durability, performance or use of "your work"; and
 - (2) The providing of or failure to provide warnings or instructions.

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA AMENDATORY ENDORSEMENT

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the: COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

A. Section I - Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability is amended as follows:

- 1. Subparagraphs (1), (2) and (3) of Exclusion j. Aircraft Or Watercraft are replaced with the following:
 - (1) A watercraft while ashore on premises you own or rent:
 - (2) A watercraft you do not own that is:
 - (a) Less than 26 feet long, unless a longer length is provided for in the "underlying insurance"; and
 - (b) Not being used to carry persons or property for a charge;
 - (3) Liability assumed under any "insured contract" for the ownership, maintenance or use of aircraft or watercraft;

Exceptions (1), (2) and (3) above only apply if valid "underlying insurance" for the watercraft liability risks described above exists or would have existed but for the exhaustion of underlying limits for "bodily injury" and "property damage".

2. The first sentence of the first paragraph of Exclusion s. Professional Services is replaced with the following:

"Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the rendering of or failure to render any professional service, unless such "bodily injury" or "property damage" is covered by valid "underlying insurance".

- B. Section I Coverage B Personal And Advertising Injury Liability is amended as follows:
 - 1. The first sentence of the first paragraph of Exclusion a. (15) Professional Services is replaced with the following:

Arising out of the rendering of or failure to render any professional service, unless such "personal and advertising injury" is covered by valid "underlying insurance".

C. Section V - Definitions is amended as follows:

The definitions of "advertisement", and "personal and advertising injury" are replaced with the following:

- "Advertisement" means widespread dissemination of information or images to the general public or specific market segments about your goods, products or services for the purpose of attracting customers or supporters. "Advertisement" includes:
 - a. Material placed on the Internet or on similar electronic means of communication about your goods, products or services for the purpose of attracting customers or supporters; and
 - **b.** Regarding web sites, only that part of a web site that is about your goods, products or services for the purposes of attracting customers or supporters is considered an advertisement.

However, "advertisement" does not include any:

- a. Design, printed material, information or images contained in, on or upon the packaging or labeling of any goods or products; or
- **b.** Display of goods, products or services at your physical place of business or at any other physical location such as in showrooms or at trade shows.
- 2. "Personal and advertising injury" means injury, including consequential "bodily injury", arising out of one or more of the following offenses:
 - **a.** False arrest, detention or imprisonment;
 - **b.** Malicious prosecution;

- **c.** The wrongful eviction from, wrongful entry into, or invasion of the right of private occupancy of a room, dwelling or premises that a person occupies, committed by or on behalf of its owner, landlord or lessor;
- **d.** Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that slanders or libels a person or organization or disparages a person's or organization's goods, products or services;
- e. Oral or written publication, in any manner, of material that violates a person's right of privacy;

- f. The use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement"; or
- **g.** Infringing upon another's copyright, trade dress or slogan in your "advertisement".

Damages because of "personal and advertising injury" do not include disgorgement, restitution or any other similar monetary amount based, in whole or in part, on an insured's unlawful gain or profit, alleged or otherwise.

As part of our commitment to provide insurance products built for modern policyholders, we have made changes to your Umbrella policy.

You may notice changes in your renewal policy's coverage documents, including a new Umbrella coverage form, Declarations and endorsements. Many of these changes result from of our adoption of the latest industry standard forms. These forms provide you with better readability, comprehension and clarity in your Umbrella coverage. While we list many changes in this document, the higher limits of liability coverage that your Umbrella policy provides for your covered Farmers policies and our commitment to you is ultimately the same.

This notice summarizes major changes within the policy that broaden, clarify or reduce coverage from your current Umbrella policy. However, it does not reference every editorial change made to your policy, nor is it part of your insurance contract. It is not a substitute for reviewing your policy and its endorsements.

Please review your policy, including the Declarations pages and all endorsements, to understand the terms and conditions of your coverage.

If you have any questions about the changes to your insurance coverage, please contact your Farmers agent.

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE

A. BROADENED COVERAGE:

Bodily Injury and Property Damage Exclusions :

Your policy excludes some types of liability, meaning that we do not provide coverage for those losses. The new policy adds exceptions to some of these exclusions, meaning that we do insure you for losses described in the exception.

- 1. The policy has an exclusion for Contractual Liability. An exception allows coverage for litigation expenses incurred by or for a party other than you.
- 2. The policy has an exclusion for Liquor Liability unless you have valid underlying insurance for liquor liability. An exception allows coverage with respect to permitting a person to bring alcoholic beverages onto your premises for consumption on your premises.
- 3. The policy has an exclusion for Pollution. An exception allows coverage for injury or damage sustained within a building and caused by the release of gases, fumes or vapors from materials brought into that building by you or on your behalf by a contractor or subcontractor.
- 4. The policy has an exclusion for Aircraft or Watercraft. An exception allows coverage for an aircraft that is chartered by, loaned to, or hired by you with a paid crew.
- 5. The policy has an exclusion for Damage to Property. An exception allows coverage for liability assumed under a sidetrack or trailer interchange agreement.

Supplementary Payments:

- 1. Coverage for Defense Costs is not subject to the Limit of Insurance.
- 2. We have increased the amount provided for the cost of bail bonds from \$250 to \$2,000.

Who is an insured:

1. Volunteer workers are considered insureds while performing duties related to the conduct of your business.

Limits of Insurance:

- 1. The Aggregate Limit is not reduced by bodily injury or property damage arising out of the use of a covered auto.
- 2. The policy premium is not considered fully earned if the Aggregate Limit is exhausted before the policy's termination date.

Definitions:

1. The definition of insured contract includes contracts with or for architects, engineers, or surveyors.

B. CLARIFICATION OF COVERAGE:

Insuring Agreements:

- 1. The Insuring Agreements clearly state that we will pay for damages on your behalf because of bodily injury, property damage, or personal and advertising injury.
- 2. The Insuring Agreements state that the insurance provided under each Coverage Part applies only to injury or damage that is subject to an applicable retained limit or scheduled underlying insurance. We have added a new table to the Umbrella Declarations to indicate additional underlying coverages which apply.

Bodily Injury and Property Damage Exclusions :

- 1. The Liquor Liability exclusion and the Aircraft or Watercraft exclusion apply to allegations of negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others.
- 2. The Liquor Liability exclusion and the Aircraft or Watercraft exclusion states that any Liquor Liability or Aircraft or Watercraft coverage provided by the Umbrella will follow the provisions of the applicable underlying insurance.
- 3. The policy excludes Employer's Liability. An exception allows coverage for injuries arising out of a covered auto, to a domestic employee, when they are not covered by worker's compensation benefits.

Supplementary Payments:

1. We will only have the right to settle suits against you when the duty to defend exists.

Who is an insured:

1. Additional Insureds included on an underlying insurance policy are now automatically insureds under this policy.

Limits of Insurance:

- 1. The Limits of Insurance section includes an Each Occurrence Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage and a Personal and Advertising Injury Limit. These limits are equal to the Aggregate limit, and do not reduce or alter coverage in any way.
- 2. The Limits of Insurance section includes rules addressing underlying insurance that has non-concurrent effective dates, or is written on a claims-made basis.

Conditions:

1. The Transfer of Defense condition explains how the duty to defend you in a claim transfers to this policy, when the applicable coverage in the underlying policy is used up.

Definitions:

- 1. The Auto definition includes any land vehicle which is subject to compulsory or financial responsibility law, or other motor vehicle law. The Mobile Equipment definition does not include these land vehicles.
- 2. The Insured Contract definition includes language regarding rental or lease of Autos.
- 3. The Property Damage definition includes information regarding Covered Autos and Pollution Cost or Expense.
- **4.** The Self-Insured Retention definition specifically explains when it applies.
- 5. Marijuana, Pollution Cost or Expense, Unmanned Aircraft, and Volunteer Worker are newly defined terms.

C. REDUCTION OF COVERAGE:

Insuring Agreement:

- 1. The insurance provided under the Bodily Injury and Property Damage Insuring Agreement does not apply to injury or damage that you know to have occurred prior to the policy period, which continued into, changed or resumed during the current policy period.
- 2. For Umbrella policies, which previously included the E3082-ED1 "Contractor Limitation of Coverage Follow Form", only the limit of the first applicable term is available rather than the highest potential limit of insurance.

Bodily Injury and Property Damage Exclusions:

- 1. The Liquor Liability exclusion applies even if claims against you allege negligence or other wrongdoing in providing or failing to provide transportation with respect to any person that may be under the influence of alcohol.
- 2. The Auto Coverages exclusion applies to loss, cost or expense payable under or resulting from any Uninsured or Underinsured motorist law. This is a reduction in coverage if your previous Umbrella policy contained an endorsement providing coverage for underlying Uninsured or Underinsured Motorist coverage.
- 3. The Employment-Related Practices exclusion applies to any injury to a person associated with the employment of that person, whether it occurs before, during or after their employment. It reinforces that coverage does not apply for injury to a person caused by the malicious prosecution of that person.
- 4. The Damage to Property exclusion applies to property you own, rent, or occupy for any reason, and includes any costs for prevention of injury to a person or damage to another's property. It also applies to damage to property transported by you and arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of a covered auto.
- 5. The Personal and Advertising Injury exclusion applies to bodily injury arising out of personal and advertising injury.
- 6. The Electronic Data exclusion applies to damages arising out of the loss of, loss of use of, damage to, corruption of, inability to access or inability to manipulate electronic data when no valid underlying coverage is provided.
- 7. The Recording and Distribution of Material in Violation of Law exclusion applies to injury or damage arising out of any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate various laws, statutes, ordinances or regulations that prohibit or limit the sending, transmitting, communicating or distribution of material or information.
- 8. The Communicable Disease exclusion removes coverage for liability arising out of the actual or alleged transmission of a communicable disease.
- 9. The Marijuana exclusion removes coverage for bodily injury and property damage arising out of, caused by or attributable to marijuana.
- 10. The Asbestos and Silica exclusion removes coverage for silica-related dust.

Personal and Advertising Injury Exclusions:

- 1. The Employment-Related Practices exclusion applies to events that occur before, during or after employment, and specifically excludes malicious prosecution.
- 2. The Professional Services exclusion applies to the rendering or failure to render any professional service, unless covered by underlying insurance.
- **3.** The Marijuana exclusion removes coverage for personal and advertising injury arising out of, caused by or attributable to marijuana.
- 4. The Unmanned Aircraft exclusion removes coverage for personal and advertising injury arising out of the ownership, maintenance, use or entrustment to others of any unmanned aircraft.

NEW CONDITIONAL ENDORSEMENTS

This section provides a general overview of endorsements that do not automatically apply to every policy, but may have applied to your policy. All endorsements applicable to your policy are listed in the Forms and Endorsements section of your Umbrella Declarations. Please refer to the following described changes for any endorsements listed below that apply to your policy.

A. BROADENED COVERAGE:

- 1. <u>Garage Endorsement (CU22311207)</u> provides broader coverage for garage operations by limiting certain exclusions. It also provides Garagekeepers coverage, when it exists on applicable underlying insurance.
- 2. <u>Broad Form Products Coverage (CU24160900)</u> broadens coverage for auto service and repair businesses by removing the exclusion for Damage to Your Product.
- 3. <u>Directors and Officers Liability Coverage Follow Form Endorsement (Condos and Cooperatives) U5105</u> broadens coverage by providing a 60-day automatic reporting period for claims in the case of policy cancellation.
- 4. <u>Directors and Officers Liability Coverage Follow Form Endorsement (Office Condominiums) U5106</u> broadens coverage by providing a 60-day automatic reporting period for claims in the case of policy cancellation.

B. CLARIFICATION OF COVERAGE:

- 1. <u>Professional Liability Exclusion Computer Data Processing (CU22930413)</u> reinforces that there is no coverage for liability arising out of any act, error or omission with respect to data processing services.
- 2. <u>Two or More Coverage Parts, Forms or Policies (U5303)</u> states that in the event a loss is covered by two or more Umbrella forms or policies issued by us, the most we will pay for that loss is the single highest limit available.
- 3. These endorsements reinforce that the applicable exclusion applies even if claims allege negligence or other wrongdoing in your hiring, employment, training, supervision or monitoring of others:
 - Exclusion Financial Services (CU21150413)
 - Exclusion Testing Or Consulting Errors and Omissions (CU22840413)
 - Professional Liability Exclusion Computer Data Processing (CU22930413)
 - Exclusion Computer Software Professional Liability (U5211)
 - Exclusion Counseling Services (U5213)
 - Limitation of Coverage Real Estate and Property Management Operations (U5304)

C. REDUCTION OF COVERAGE:

- 1. <u>Exclusion Computer Software Professional Liability (U5211)</u> excludes professional liability related to computer software unless coverage is provided in the underlying insurance.
- 2. <u>Exclusion Corporal Punishment (CU22020900)</u> excludes property damage and personal and advertising injury, in addition to bodily injury to a student arising out of corporal punishment.
- **3.** <u>Exclusion New Multi-Unit Residential Construction (U5225)</u> excludes coverage for any property damage arising out of your work and your product in connection with new multi-unit residential construction.
- 4. <u>Limitation of Coverage to Designated Premises, Project or Operation (U5302)</u> limits coverage to bodily injury, property damage, and personal and advertising injury that arises out of premises, projects, or operations covered by underlying insurance.
- Public or Livery Passenger Conveyance and On-Demand Delivery Services Exclusion (CU21901116) excludes a covered auto from coverage while being used as part of a transportation network program or to provide delivery services.
- 6. <u>College or Schools (U5101)</u> excludes coverage for bodily injury or property damage arising out of the transportation of students and the ownership or operation of an infirmary, clinic or hospital. Personal and advertising injury related to the ownership or operation of an infirmary, clinic or hospital is also excluded.

NUCLEAR ENERGY LIABILITY EXCLUSION ENDORSEMENT

(Broad Form)

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

I. The insurance does not apply:

- **A.** Under any Liability Coverage, to "bodily injury" or "property damage":
 - (1) With respect to which an insured under the policy is also an insured under a nuclear energy liability policy issued by Nuclear Energy Liability Insurance Association, Mutual Atomic Energy Liability Underwriters, Nuclear Insurance Association of Canada or any of their successors, or would be an insured under any such policy but for its termination upon exhaustion of its limit of liability; or
 - (2) Resulting from the "hazardous properties" of "nuclear material" and with respect to which (a) any person or organization is required to maintain financial protection pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, or any law amendatory thereof, or (b) the insured is, or had this policy not been issued would be, entitled to indemnity from the United States of America, or any agency thereof, under any agreement entered into by the United States of America, or any agency thereof, with any person or organization.
- **B.** Under any Liability Coverage, to "bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from "hazardous properties" of "nuclear material", if:
 - The "nuclear material" (a) is at any "nuclear facility" owned by, or operated by or on behalf of, an insured or (b) has been discharged or dispersed therefrom;

- (2) The "nuclear material" is contained in "spent fuel" or "waste" at any time possessed, handled, used, processed, stored, transported or disposed of, by or on behalf of an insured; or
- (3) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" arises out of the furnishing by an insured of services, materials, parts or equipment in connection with the planning, construction, maintenance, operation or use of any "nuclear facility", but if such facility is located within the United States of America, its territories or possessions or Canada, this Exclusion (3) applies only to "property damage" to such "nuclear facility" and any property thereat.
- **II.** As used in this endorsement:

"Hazardous properties" includes radioactive, toxic or explosive properties.

"Nuclear material" means "source material", "Special nuclear material" or "by-product material".

"Source material", "special nuclear material", and "by-product material" have the meanings given them in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 or in any law amendatory thereof.

"Spent fuel" means any fuel element or fuel component, solid or liquid, which has been used or exposed to radiation in a "nuclear reactor".

"Waste" means any waste material **(a)** containing "by-product material" other than the tailings or wastes produced by the extraction or concentration of uranium or thorium from any ore processed primarily for its "source material" content, and **(b)** resulting from the operation by any person or organization of any "nuclear facility" included under the first two paragraphs of the definition of "nuclear facility". "Nuclear facility" means:

- (a) Any "nuclear reactor";
- (b) Any equipment or device designed or used for

 (1) separating the isotopes of uranium or
 plutonium, (2) processing or utilizing "spent
 fuel", or (3) handling, processing or packaging
 "waste";
- (c) Any equipment or device used for the processing, fabricating or alloying of "special nuclear material" if at any time the total amount of such material in the custody of the insured at the premises where such equipment or device is located consists of or contains more than 25 grams of plutonium or uranium 233 or any combination thereof, or more than 250 grams of uranium 235;
- (d) Any structure, basin, excavation, premises or place prepared or used for the storage or disposal of "waste";

and includes the site on which any of the foregoing is located, all operations conducted on such site and all premises used for such operations.

"Nuclear reactor" means any apparatus designed or used to sustain nuclear fission in a self-supporting chain reaction or to contain a critical mass of fissionable material.

"Property damage" includes all forms of radioactive contamination of property.



AMENDMENT OF PERSONAL AND ADVERTISING INJURY EXCLUSION

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

 A. Exclusion a. "Personal and advertising injury" of Section I - Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability is amended as follows:

Subparagraphs (3), (9) and (11) are deleted and replaced with:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

"Personal and advertising injury":

(3) Material Published Prior To Policy Period

Arising out of oral or written publication, in any manner, of material whose first publication took place before the beginning of the policy period, whether or not any publication made prior to the inception of the policy:

- (a) Violated or infringed upon another's rights; or
- (b) Was or is actionable.

(9) Infringement Of Copyright, Patent, Trademark Or Trade Secret

Arising out of the infringement of copyright, patent, trademark, trade dress, slogan, service mark, trade secret or other intellectual property rights. However, this exclusion does not apply if the sole and exclusive basis for the claim is infringement, in your "advertisement", of:

- (a) Copyright;
- (b) Trade dress; or
- (c) Slogan, unless the slogan is also a trademark, trade name, service mark or other designation of origin or authenticity.

(11) Electronic Chatrooms Or Bulletin Boards

Arising out of an electronic chatroom or bulletin board, blog or any other virtual forum the insured hosts, owns, or over which the insured exercises control.







AMENDED POLLUTION EXCLUSION

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

Exclusion i. under Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I -Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability is replaced by the following:

This insurance does not apply to:

- i. Pollution
 - (1) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which would not have occurred in whole or part but for the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of "pollutants" at any time:
 - (a) At or from any premises, site or location which is or was at any time owned or occupied by, or rented or loaned to, any insured. However, this subparagraph does not apply to:
 - (i) "Bodily injury" if sustained within a building and caused by smoke, fumes, vapor or soot produced by or originating from equipment that is used to heat, cool or dehumidify the building, or equipment that is used to heat water for personal use, by the building's occupants or their guests;
 - (ii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" for which you may be held liable, if you are a contractor and the owner or lessee of such premises, site or location has been added to your policy as an additional insured with respect to your ongoing operations performed for that additional insured at that premises, site or location and such premises, site or location is not and never was owned or occupied by, or rented or loaned to, any insured, other than that additional insured; or
 - (iii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of heat, smoke or fumes from a hostile fire;

- (b) At or from any premises, site or location which is or was at any time used by or for any insured or others for the handling, storage, disposal, processing or treatment of waste;
- (c) Which are or were at any time transported, handled, stored, treated or disposed of, or processed as waste by or for any insured, or any person or organization for whom you may be legally responsible;
- (d) At or from any premises, site or location on which any insured or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on any insured's behalf are performing operations if the "pollutants" are brought on or to the premises, site or location in connection with such operations by such insured, contractor or subcontractor. However, this subparagraph does not apply to:
 - (i) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of the escape of fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids which are needed to perform the normal electrical, hydraulic or mechanical functions necessary for the operation of "mobile equipment" or its parts, if such fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids escape from a vehicle part designed to hold, store or receive them. This exception does not apply if the "bodily injury" or "property damage" arises out of the intentional discharge, dispersal or release of the fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids, or if such fuels, lubricants or other operating fluids are brought on or to the premises, site or location with the intent that they be discharged, dispersed or released as part of the operations being performed by such insured. contractor or subcontractor:

- (ii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" sustained within a building and caused by the release of gases, fumes or vapors from materials brought into that building in connection with operations being performed by you or on your behalf by a contractor or subcontractor; or
- (iii) "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of heat, smoke or fumes from a "hostile fire";
- (e) At or from any premises, site or location on which any insured or any contractors or subcontractors working directly or indirectly on any insured's behalf are performing operations to test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify, neutralize or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants".
- (f) That are, or that are contained in any property that is:
 - (i) Being transported or towed by, handled or handled for movement into, onto or from a "covered auto";
 - (ii) Otherwise in the course of transit by or on behalf of the "insured"; or
 - (iii) Being stored, disposed of, treated or processed in or upon a "covered auto";

However, Paragraph **(f)** above does not apply to fuels, lubricants, fluids, exhaust gases or other similar "pollutants" that are needed for or result from the normal electrical, hydraulic or mechanical functioning of a "covered auto" or its parts, if:

- i. The "pollutants" escape, seep, migrate or are discharged, dispersed or released directly from an "auto" part designed by its manufacturer to hold, store, receive or dispose of such "pollutants"; and
- ii. The "bodily injury", "property damage" or "covered pollution cost

or expense" does not arise out of the operation of any equipment listed in Paragraph **12.e.** of the definition of "mobile equipment"; or

(g) Before the "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are moved from the place where they are accepted by the "insured" for movement into or onto a "covered auto" or after they are moved from a "covered auto" to the place where they are finally delivered, disposed of or abandoned by the "insured".

However, Paragraph **(g)** above does not apply to "accidents" that occur away from premises owned by or rented to an "insured" with respect to "pollutants" not in or upon a covered "auto" if:

- (i) The "pollutants" or any property in which the "pollutants" are contained are upset, overturned or damaged as a result of the maintenance or use of a covered "auto"; and
- (ii) The discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, release or escape of the "pollutants" is caused directly by such upset, overturn or damage.
- (2) Any loss, cost or expense arising out of any:
 - (a) Request, demand, order or statutory or regulatory requirement that any insured or others test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or neutralize, or in any way respond to, or assess the effects of, "pollutants"; or
 - (b) Claim or "suit" by or on behalf of a governmental authority for damages because of testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying or neutralizing, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "pollutants".

As used in this endorsement, a hostile fire means one which becomes uncontrollable or breaks out from where it was intended to be.





EXCLUSION - EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES LIABILITY

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

This insurance does not apply to coverage provided by the Employment Practices Liability Insurance in the "underlying insurance".



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EXCLUSION - MARIJUANA

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

A. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I - Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Marijuana

- a. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of, caused by, or attributable to, whether in whole or in part, the following:
 - 1. The design, cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, serving, furnishing, use or possession of "marijuana";
 - The actual, alleged, threatened or suspected inhalation, ingestion, absorption or consumption of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of "marijuana"; or
- b. "Property damage" to "marijuana".

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the supervision, hiring, employment, training or monitoring of others.

However, this exclusion does not apply to any "marijuana" that is not designed, manufactured, distributed, sold, served or furnished for bodily:

- a. Ingestion;
- **b.** Inhalation;
- c. Absorption; or
- d. Consumption.
- B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I - Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Marijuana

- a. "Personal and advertising injury" arising out of, caused by, or attributable to, whether in whole or in part, the following:
 - 1. The design, cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, serving, furnishing, use or possession of "marijuana"; or
 - 2. The actual, alleged, threatened or suspected inhalation, ingestion, absorption or consumption of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of "marijuana".
- **C.** For the purposes of this endorsement, the following definition is added to **Section V Definitions**:

"Marijuana" means:

- Any good or product that consists of or contains any amount of Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC), Cannabidiol (CBD) or any other cannabinoid, regardless of whether any such cannabinoid is natural or synthetic.
- **2.** Paragraph **C.1.** above includes, but is not limited to, any of the following containing such cannabinoid:
 - a. Any plant of the genus Cannabis L., or any part thereof, such as seeds, stems, flowers, stalks and roots; or
 - **b.** Any compound, byproduct, extract, derivative, mixture or combination, such as, but not limited to:
 - (1) Resin, oil or wax;
 - (2) Hash or hemp; or
 - (3) Infused liquid or edible marijuana;

whether derived from any plant or part of any plant set forth in Paragraph **C.2.a.** above or not.





EXCLUSION - MOLD AND MICROORGANISM

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

A. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I - Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Mold And Microorganism

- a. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which would not have occurred, in whole or in part, but for the actual, alleged or threatened inhalation of, ingestion of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, any "mold" or "microorganism" on or within a building or structure, including its contents, regardless of whether any other cause, event, material or product contributed concurrently or in any sequence to such injury or damage.
- b. Any loss, cost or expenses arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "mold" or "microorganism", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "bodily injury" or "property damage".

This exclusion does not apply to any "mold" or "microorganism" that are, are on, or are contained in, a good or product intended for bodily consumption. B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.
 Exclusions of Section I - Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Mold And Microorganism

- а. "Personal and advertising injury" which would not have taken place, in whole or in part, but for the actual, alleged or threatened inhalation of, ingestion of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of any "mold" or "microorganism" on or within a building or structure, including its contents, regardless of whether any other cause, event, material or product contributed concurrently or in any sequence to such injury.
- b. Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "mold" or "microorganism", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "personal and advertising injury".

- C. The following definitions are added to Section V Definitions:
 - 1. "Mold" means any type or form of fungus, including but not limited to, mildew, mycotoxins, spores, scents or by-products produced or released by mold.
- 2. "Microorganism" means any organism (animal or plant) of microscopic size, including but not limited to, any type or form of bacteria, bacterium, germ, intestinal flora, microbe, pathogen or virus or any part or by-product of any of the above.

COMMON POLICY CONDITIONS

All Coverage Parts included in this policy are subject to the following conditions.

A. Cancellation

- 1. The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations may cancel this policy by mailing or delivering to us advance written notice of cancellation.
- 2. We may cancel this policy by mailing or delivering to the first Named Insured written notice of cancellation at least:
 - **a.** 10 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for nonpayment of premium; or
 - **b.** 30 days before the effective date of cancellation if we cancel for any other reason.
- **3.** We will mail or deliver our notice to the first Named Insured's last mailing address known to us.
- **4.** Notice of cancellation will state the effective date of cancellation. The policy period will end on that date.
- **5.** If this policy is cancelled, we will send the first Named Insured any premium refund due. If we cancel, the refund will be pro rata. If the first Named Insured cancels, the refund may be less than pro rata. The cancellation will be effective even if we have not made or offered a refund.
- **6.** If notice is mailed, proof of mailing will be sufficient proof of notice.

B. Changes

This policy contains all the agreements between you and us concerning the insurance afforded. The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations is authorized to make changes in the terms of this policy with our consent. This policy's terms can be amended or waived only by endorsement issued by us and made a part of this policy.

C. Examination Of Your Books And Records

We may examine and audit your books and records as they relate to this policy at any time during the policy period and up to three years afterward.

D. Inspections And Surveys

- 1. We have the right to:
 - a. Make inspections and surveys at any time;

- b. Give you reports on the conditions we find; and
- c. Recommend changes.
- 2. We are not obligated to make any inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations and any such actions we do undertake relate only to insurability and the premiums to be charged. We do not make safety inspections. We do not undertake to perform the duty of any person or organization to provide for the health or safety of workers or the public. And we do not warrant that conditions:
 - a. Are safe or healthful; or
 - **b.** Comply with laws, regulations, codes or standards.
- **3.** Paragraphs **1.** and **2.** of this condition apply not only to us, but also to any rating, advisory, rate service or similar organization which makes insurance inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations.
- 4. Paragraph 2. of this condition does not apply to any inspections, surveys, reports or recommendations we may make relative to certification, under state or municipal statutes, ordinances or regulations, of boilers, pressure vessels or elevators.

E. Premiums

The first Named Insured shown in the Declarations:

- 1. Is responsible for the payment of all premiums; and
- 2. Will be the payee for any return premiums we pay.

F. Transfer Of Your Rights And Duties Under This Policy

Your rights and duties under this policy may not be transferred without our written consent except in the case of death of an individual named insured.

If you die, your rights and duties will be transferred to your legal representative but only while acting within the scope of duties as your legal representative. Until your legal representative is appointed, anyone having proper temporary custody of your property will have your rights and duties but only with respect to that property.

THIS ENDORSEMENT CHANGES THE POLICY. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY. OREGON CHANGES - DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP

- **b.** Testing for a communicable disease;
- c. Failure to prevent the spread of the disease; or
- d. Failure to report the disease to authorities.

B. The following is added to Paragraph 2.a. of Section I Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

a. "Personal and advertising injury":

Communicable Disease

Arising out of the actual or alleged transmission of a communicable disease.

This exclusion applies even if the claims against any insured allege negligence or other wrongdoing in the:

- (1) Supervising, hiring, employing, training or monitoring of others that may be infected with and spread a communicable disease;
- (2) Testing for a communicable disease;
- (3) Failure to prevent the spread of the disease; or
- (4) Failure to report the disease to authorities.

EXCLUSION - UNMANNED AIRCRAFT (COVERAGE B ONLY)

This exclusion does not apply to:

- **a.** The use of another's advertising idea in your "advertisement"; or
- **b.** Infringing upon another's copyright, trade dress or slogan in your "advertisement".

"Unmanned aircraft" means an aircraft that is not:

to be controlled directly by a person from within or on the aircraft.

- (2) The loss of, loss of use of, damage to, corruption of, inability to access, or inability to manipulate electronic data.

This exclusion applies even if damages are claimed for notification costs, credit monitoring expenses, forensic expenses, public relations expenses or any other loss, cost or expense incurred by you or others arising out of that which is described in Paragraph (1) or (2) above.

As used in this exclusion, electronic data means information, facts or programs stored as or on, created or used on, or transmitted to or from computer software, including systems and applications software, hard or floppy disks, CD-ROMs, tapes, drives, cells, data processing devices or any other media which are used with electronically controlled equipment.

B. The following is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I - Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Access Or Disclosure Of Confidential Or Personal Information

"Personal and advertising injury" arising out of any access to or disclosure of any person's or organization's confidential or personal information, including patents, trade secrets, processing methods, customer lists, financial information, credit card information, health information or any other type of nonpublic information.

This exclusion applies even if damages are claimed for notification costs, credit monitoring expenses, forensic expenses, public relations expenses or any other loss, cost or expense incurred by you or others arising out of any access to or disclosure of any person's or organization's confidential or personal information.

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

- A. Paragraph 14. Expanded Coverage Territory under Section IV Conditions does not apply.
- **B.** The definition of "coverage territory" in the **Definitions** section is replaced by the following:

"Coverage territory" means:

- a. The United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Puerto Rico and Canada;
- **b.** International waters or airspace, but only if the injury or damage occurs in the course of travel or transportation between any places included in **a.** above; or
- **c.** All other parts of the world if the injury or damage arises out of:
 - (1) Goods or products made or sold by you in the territory described in **a**. above;

- (2) The activities of a person whose home is in the territory described in **a**. above, but is away for a short time on your business; or
- (3) "Personal and advertising injury" offenses that take place through the Internet or similar electronic means of communication;

provided the insured's responsibility to pay damages is determined in a "suit" on the merits, in the territory described in **a**. above or in a settlement we agree to.

- b. "Property damage" arising, in whole or in part, out of the actual, alleged, threatened or suspected contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust".
- c. Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "bodily injury" or "property damage".
- B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.
 Exclusions of Section I Coverage B Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:
 - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Asbestos, Silica Or Silica-Related Dust

a. "Personal and advertising injury" arising, in whole or in part, out of the actual, alleged, threatened or suspected inhalation of, ingestion of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust". b. Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust", by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "personal and advertising injury".
- C. For the purpose of this endorsement, Section V -Definitions is amended as follows:
 - **1.** The following definitions are added:
 - **a.** "Silica" means silicon dioxide (occurring in crystalline, amorphous and impure forms), silica particles, silica dust or silica compounds.
 - **b.** "Silica-related dust" means a mixture or combination of silica and other dust or particles.
 - 2. The following definitions are amended:
 - a. "Bodily injury" is amended to include mental injury, anguish, distress or fear of cancer or other injury, illness or disease caused by or related to asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust", or exposure to asbestos, "silica" or "silica-related dust".

- a. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" arising out of, resulting from, caused by or contributed to by lead, or any hazardous properties of lead. This includes, but is not limited to "lead poisoning" and "lead contamination" and the threat or fear of "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination".
- **b.** Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of:
 - (1) The abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, lead, lead compounds or materials containing lead; or
 - (2) The testing or monitoring for or the treatment of "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination" in humans or animals;

by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "bodily injury" or "property damage".
- B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2.
 Exclusions of Section I Coverage B Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Lead Poisoning And Contamination

- a. "Personal and advertising injury" arising, out of, resulting from, caused by or contributed to by lead, or any hazardous properties of lead. This includes, but is not limited to "lead poisoning" and "lead contamination" and the threat or fear of "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination".
- **b.** Any loss, cost or expense arising, in whole or in part, out of:
 - (1) The abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to or assessing the effects of, lead, lead compounds or materials containing lead; or
 - (2) The testing or monitoring for or the treatment of "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination" in humans or animals;

by any insured or by any other person or entity.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Any supervision, instructions, recommendations, warnings or advice given or which should have been given in connection with the above; and
- (2) Any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of such "personal and advertising injury".
- C. For the purpose of this endorsement, Section V -Definitions is amended as follows:
 - 1. The following definitions are added:
 - **a.** "Lead poisoning" includes, but is not limited to, actual "bodily injury" or "personal injury" resulting from exposure or ingestion, of any nature, cause or duration, to or of lead, or products, objects or substances comprised of or containing lead.
 - **b.** "Lead contamination" includes, but is not limited to, the presence of lead in paint, soil, air, plants, animals, water pipes, buildings or other structures.

- **2.** The following definitions are amended:
 - a. "Bodily injury" is amended to include mental injury, anguish, distress or fear of any injury, illness or disease caused by or related to "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination".
- **b.** "Property damage" is amended to include actual or threatened loss of property value, loss of equity, loss of use, loss or rents or other economic injury caused by "lead poisoning" or "lead contamination".





TWO OR MORE COVERAGE PARTS, FORMS OR POLICIES

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMON POLICY CONDITIONS

- 1. The following paragraph is added to the Common Policy Conditions and supersedes any provision to the contrary:
 - A. Two Or More Coverage Parts, Forms Or Policies If this Umbrella Coverage Part and any other Umbrella Coverage Form, Coverage Part or Umbrella Policy, issued by us or any company affiliated with us, provide coverage to anyone

who qualifies as an insured under this Umbrella

Coverage Part and apply to the same accident, claim, damage, loss, "occurrence", offense or "suit", then the aggregate maximum Limit of Insurance under all of these shall not exceed the highest applicable Limit of Insurance under one Umbrella Coverage Part, Umbrella Coverage Form or Umbrella Policy.





DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS LIABILITY COVERAGE - FOLLOW FORM ENDORSEMENT (CONDOMINIUMS AND COOPERATIVES)

THIS ENDORSEMENT INCLUDES CLAIMS-MADE AND REPORTED COVERAGES. SUBJECT TO ITS TERMS, THIS COVERAGE FORM'S CLAIMS-MADE COVERAGES APPLY ONLY TO ANY CLAIM FIRST MADE AGAINST THE INSURED DURING THE POLICY PERIOD OR THE OPTIONAL EXTENDED REPORTING PERIOD, IF APPLICABLE, PROVIDED SUCH CLAIM IS REPORTED IN WRITING TO THE COMPANY DURING THE POLICY PERIOD OR THE OPTIONAL EXTENDED REPORTING PERIOD, IF APPLICABLE.

This endorsement modifies coverage provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

If the "underlying insurance" includes applicable coverage for Directors And Officers Liability Coverage (Condominiums and Cooperatives), the coverage provided by this endorsement shall follow the same provisions, exclusions, limitations and definitions. The coverage provided under this endorsement will not be broader than that provided by the applicable "underlying insurance". This is a claims-made coverage.

I. Coverage

- **A.** We will pay on behalf of the insured those sums the insured becomes legally obligated to pay in excess of the limit of insurance of the claims-made "underlying insurance" for Directors and Officers Liability Coverage (Condominiums and Cooperatives), provided that a "claim":
 - 1. Is first made against an insured during the policy period of this policy;
 - 2. Results from injury or damage to which the claims-made "underlying insurance" would apply but for the exhaustion of its limits of insurance; and
 - **3.** Is a result of a "wrongful act" which occurred on or after the Retroactive Date as shown on the applicable underlying claims-made Coverage Form, but before the last day of the policy period of this policy or the cancellation date, whichever comes first.
- B. Supplementary Payments Coverages A And B under Section I - Coverages is amended to include any "claim" or "suit" to which coverage for claims-made insurance provided by the underlying Directors and Officers Liability Coverage Form (Condominiums and Cooperatives) applies.

- C. The amount we will pay is limited as described in Supplementary Payments - Coverages A And B under Section I - Coverages and Section III -Limits Of Insurance.
- II. Extended Reporting Periods
 - A. Automatic Extended Reporting Period
 - We will provide an Automatic Extended Reporting Period for the excess coverage provided by this endorsement without additional charge. This Automatic Extended Reporting Period starts with the end of the policy period of the applicable claims-made "underlying insurance" and lasts for 60 days.
 - 2. The Automatic Extended Reporting Period does not apply to "claims" that are covered under any subsequent insurance you purchase, or that would be covered but for exhaustion of the amount of insurance applicable to such "claims".
 - **3.** The Automatic Extended Reporting Period may not be cancelled.

B. Optional Extended Reporting Period

1. We will issue an Optional Extended Reporting Period Endorsement if the Named Insured shown in the Declarations:

- a. Makes a written request to purchase the Optional Extended Reporting Period, which we receive within 60 days after the end of the policy period set forth in the Declarations or the cancellation date, whichever occurs first; and
- **b.** Promptly pays the additional premium when due.

The provision in Paragraph **1.a.** only applies to the same extent that a written request is required for the Optional Extended Reporting Period of the applicable claims-made "underlying insurance".

- **2.** The Optional Extended Reporting Period will not take effect unless:
 - a. The additional premium is paid when due; and
 - **b.** An Optional Extended Reporting Period is purchased on the applicable claims-made "underlying insurance".
- **3.** The premium for the Optional Extended Reporting Period Endorsement will be 200% of the annual premium for this excess coverage for Directors and Officers Liability Coverage. It will be fully earned when the Optional Extended Reporting Period Endorsement takes effect.
- **C.** Our Extended Reporting Period(s) will be for the same duration as, and available in accordance with the same terms and conditions as the Extended Reporting Period(s) of the applicable claims-made "underlying insurance".
- **D.** The Extended Reporting Periods do not extend the "policy period", reinstate or increase the Limits of Insurance available, or change the scope of coverage provided.
- **E.** The Extended Reporting Periods will only apply to "claims" for "wrongful acts" which occurred on or after the Retroactive Date as shown on the

applicable claims-made "underlying insurance", but before the last day of the policy period of this policy or the cancellation date, whichever comes first.

F. A "claim" first made during the Extended Reporting Period(s) will be deemed to have been made on the last day of the policy period of this policy or the cancellation date, whichever comes first.

III. Definitions

For the purposes of coverage provided by this endorsement, the following definitions are added to **Section V** - **Definitions:**

- A. "Claim" means:
 - **1.** A written demand for monetary damage or non-monetary relief;
 - **2.** A civil proceeding commenced by the service of a complaint or similar pleading;
 - **3.** A criminal proceeding commenced by the return of an indictment; or
 - **4.** A formal administrative or regulatory proceeding commenced by the filing of a notice of charges, formal investigative order or similar document

against an insured for a "wrongful act".

B. "Wrongful act" means any actual or alleged act, error, omission, misstatement, misleading statement, neglect or breach of duties, committed or allegedly committed by you or one or more insured arising solely from their management responsibilities for the organization.

The same "wrongful act", any interrelated series of "wrongful acts" or series of similar or related "wrongful acts" by one or more Insureds, shall be deemed to be one "wrongful act" and to have commenced at the time of the earliest "wrongful act".

CONDITIONAL EXCLUSION OF TERRORISM (RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF FEDERAL TERRORISM RISK INSURANCE ACT)

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

A. Applicability Of The Provisions Of This Endorsement

- 1. The provisions of this endorsement become applicable commencing on the date when any one or more of the following first occurs. But if your policy (meaning the policy period in which this endorsement applies) begins after such date, then the provisions of this endorsement become applicable on the date your policy begins.
 - a. The federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Program ("Program"), established by the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, has terminated with respect to the type of insurance provided under this Coverage Part; or
 - b. A renewal, extension or replacement of the Program has become effective without a requirement to make terrorism coverage available to you and with revisions that:
 - (1) Increase our statutory percentage deductible under the Program for terrorism losses. (That deductible determines the amount of all certified terrorism losses we must pay in a calendar year, before the federal government shares in subsequent payment of certified terrorism losses.); or
 - (2) Decrease the federal government's statutory percentage share in potential terrorism losses above such deductible; or
 - (3) Redefine terrorism or make insurance coverage for terrorism subject to provisions or requirements that differ from those that apply to other types of events or occurrences under this policy.

- 2. If the provisions of this endorsement become applicable, such provisions:
 - a. Supersede any terrorism endorsement already endorsed to this policy that addresses "certified acts of terrorism" and/or "other acts of terrorism", but only with respect to an incident(s) of terrorism (however defined) which results in injury or damage that occurs on or after the date when the provisions of this endorsement become applicable (for claims made policies, such an endorsement is superseded only with respect to an incident of terrorism (however defined) that results in a claim for injury or damage first being made on or after the date when the provisions of this endorsement become applicable); and
 - b. Remain applicable unless we notify you of changes in these provisions, in response to federal law.
- 3. If the provisions of this endorsement do NOT become applicable, any terrorism endorsement already endorsed to this policy, that addresses "certified acts of terrorism" and/or "other acts of terrorism", will continue in effect unless we notify you of changes to that endorsement in response to federal law.
- **B.** The following definitions are added and apply under this endorsement wherever the term terrorism, or the phrase any injury or damage, are enclosed in quotation marks:
 - **1.** "Terrorism" means activities against persons, organizations or property of any nature:
 - **a.** That involve the following or preparation for the following:
 - (1) Use or threat of force or violence; or

- (2) Commission or threat of a dangerous act; or
- (3) Commission or threat of an act that interferes with or disrupts an electronic, communication, information, or mechanical system; and
- **b.** When one or both of the following applies:
 - (1) The effect is to intimidate or coerce a government or the civilian population or any segment thereof, or to disrupt any segment of the economy; or
 - (2) It appears that the intent is to intimidate or coerce a government, or to further political, ideological, religious, social or economic objectives or to express (or express opposition to) a philosophy or ideology.
- 2. "Any injury or damage" means any injury or damage covered under any Coverage Part or underlying insurance to which this endorsement is applicable, and includes but is not limited to "bodily injury", "property damage", "personal and advertising injury", "injury" or "environmental damage" as may be defined in any applicable Coverage Part or underlying insurance.
- **C.** The following exclusion is added:

EXCLUSION OF TERRORISM

We will not pay for "any injury or damage" caused directly or indirectly by "terrorism", including action in hindering or defending against an actual or expected incident of "terrorism". "Any injury or damage" is excluded regardless of any other cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to such injury or damage. But this exclusion applies only when one or more of the following are attributed to an incident of "terrorism":

- 1. The "terrorism" is carried out by means of the dispersal or application of radioactive material, or through the use of a nuclear weapon or device that involves or produces a nuclear reaction, nuclear radiation or radioactive contamination; or
- 2. Radioactive material is released, and it appears that one purpose of the "terrorism" was to release such material; or

- **3.** The "terrorism" is carried out by means of the dispersal or application of pathogenic or poisonous biological or chemical materials; or
- Pathogenic or poisonous biological or chemical materials are released, and it appears that one purpose of the "terrorism" was to release such materials; or
- 5. The total of insured damage to all types of property exceeds \$25,000,000. In determining whether the \$25,000,000 threshold is exceeded, we will include all insured damage sustained by property of all persons and entities affected by the "terrorism" and business interruption losses sustained by owners or occupants of the damaged property. For the purpose of this provision, insured damage means damage that is covered by any insurance plus damage that would be covered by any insurance but for the application of any terrorism exclusions; or
- **6.** Fifty or more persons sustain death or serious physical injury. For the purposes of this provision, serious physical injury means:
 - **a.** Physical injury that involves a substantial risk of death; or
 - **b.** Protracted and obvious physical disfigurement; or
 - **c.** Protracted loss of or impairment of the function of a bodily member or organ.

Multiple incidents of "terrorism" which occur within a 72-hour period and appear to be carried out in concert or to have a related purpose or common leadership will be deemed to be one incident, for the purpose of determining whether the thresholds in Paragraphs **C.5.** or **C.6.** are exceeded.

With respect to this Exclusion, Paragraphs **C.5.** and **C.6.** describe the threshold used to measure the magnitude of an incident of "terrorism" and the circumstances in which the threshold will apply, for the purpose of determining whether this Exclusion will apply to that incident. When the Exclusion applies to an incident of "terrorism", there is no coverage under this Coverage Part.

The terms and limitations of any terrorism exclusion, or the inapplicability or omission of a terrorism exclusion, do not serve to create coverage for injury or damage that is otherwise excluded under this Coverage Part.





EXCLUSION - PUNITIVE, EXEMPLARY OR ENHANCED DAMAGES

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

- A. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I -Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability:
 - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Punitive, Exemplary Or Enhanced Damages

This insurance does not apply to punitive damages, exemplary damages, fines, penalties, treble damages or other increase in damages resulting from the multiplication of compensatory damages.

- B. The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2. Exclusions of Section I -Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:
 - 2. Exclusions

This insurance does not apply to:

Punitive, Exemplary Or Enhanced Damages

This insurance does not apply to punitive damages, exemplary damages, fines, penalties, treble damages or other increase in damages resulting from the multiplication of compensatory damages.

A. Disclosure Of Premium

In accordance with the federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, we are required to provide you with a notice disclosing the portion of your premium, if any, attributable to coverage for terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act. The portion of your premium attributable to such coverage is shown in the Schedule of this endorsement or in the policy Declarations.

B. <u>Disclosure Of Federal Participation In Payment Of</u> <u>Terrorism Losses</u>

The United States Government, Department of the Treasury, will pay a share of terrorism losses insured under the federal program. The federal share equals a percentage (as shown in Part II of the Schedule of this endorsement or in the policy Declarations) of that portion of the amount of such insured losses that exceeds the applicable insurer retention. However, if aggregate insured losses attributable to terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act exceed \$100 billion in a calendar year the Treasury shall not make any payment for any portion of the amount of such losses that exceeds \$100 billion.

C. <u>Cap On Insurer Participation In Payment Of</u> <u>TerrorismLosses</u>

If aggregate insured losses attributable to terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act exceed \$100 billion in a calendar year and we have met our insurer deductible under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, we shall not be liable for the payment of any portion of the amount of such losses that exceeds \$100 billion, and in such case insured losses up to that amount are subject to pro rata allocation in accordance with procedures established by the Secretary of the Treasury. LIMITED TERRORISM EXCLUSION (OTHER THAN CERTIFIED ACTS OF TERRORISM); CAP ON LOSSES FROM CERTIFIED ACTS OF TERRORISM

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the policy number indicated above.

- **A.** The following definitions are added with respect to the provisions of this endorsement:
 - 1. "Certified act of terrorism" means an act that is certified by the Secretary of the Treasury, in accordance with the provisions of the federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act to be an act of terrorism pursuant to such Act. The criteria contained in the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act for a "certified act of terrorism" include the following:
 - a. The act resulted in insured losses in excess of \$5 million in the aggregate, attributable to all types of insurance subject to the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act; and
 - **b.** The act is a violent act or an act that is dangerous to human life, property or infrastructure and is committed by an individual or individuals as part of an effort to coerce the civilian population of the United States or to influence the policy or affect the conduct of the United States Government by coercion.
 - 2. "Other act of terrorism" means a violent act or an act that is dangerous to human life, property or infrastructure that is committed by an individual or individuals and that appears to be part of an effort to coerce a civilian population or to influence the policy or affect the conduct of any government by coercion, and the act is not certified as a terrorist act pursuant to the federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Act.

However, "other act of terrorism" does not include an act which meets the criteria set forth in Paragraph **b.** of the definition of "certified act of terrorism" when such act resulted in aggregate losses of \$5 million or less.

- **B.** The **Commercial Liability Umbrella Coverage Form** attached to this policy is amended as follows:
 - 1. The following exclusion is added:

This insurance does not apply to: **TERRORISM**

"Any injury or damage" arising, directly or indirectly, out of an "other act of terrorism". However, this exclusion applies only when one or more of the following are attributed to such act:

- The total of insured damage to all types of a. property exceeds \$25,000,000. In determining whether the \$25,000,000 threshold is exceeded, we will include all insured damage sustained by property of all persons and entities affected by the terrorism and business interruption losses sustained by owners or occupants of the damaged property. For the purpose of this provision, insured damage means damage that is covered by any insurance plus damage that would be covered by any insurance but for the application of any terrorism exclusions; or
- **b.** Fifty or more persons sustain death or serious physical injury. For the purposes of this provision, serious physical injury means:
 - (1) Physical injury that involves a substantial risk of death; or
 - (2) Protracted and obvious physical disfigurement; or
 - (3) Protracted loss of or impairment of the function of a bodily member or organ; or
- **c.** The terrorism involves the use, release or escape of nuclear materials, or directly or indirectly results in nuclear reaction or radiation or radioactive contamination; or
- **d.** The terrorism is carried out by means of the dispersal or application of pathogenic or poisonous biological or chemical materials; or
- e. Pathogenic or poisonous biological or chemical materials are released, and it appears that one purpose of the terrorism was to release such materials.

With respect to this exclusion, Paragraphs **C.1.a.** and **b.** describe the thresholds used to measure the magnitude of an incident of an "other act of terrorism" and the circumstances in which the threshold will apply for the purpose of determining whether this exclusion will apply to that incident.

- **2.** The following definition is added:
 - a. For the purposes of this endorsement, "any injury or damage" means any injury or damage covered under any Coverage Form to which this endorsement is applicable, and includes but is not limited to "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" as may be defined in any applicable Coverage Form.

C. APPLICATION OF OTHER EXCLUSIONS

The terms and limitations of any terrorism exclusion, or the inapplicability or omission of a terrorism exclusion, do not serve to create coverage for loss or injury or damage that is otherwise excluded under this Policy.

D. CAP ON CERTIFIED TERRORISM LOSSES

The following limitation applies to property and liability coverage for any one or more "certified acts of terrorism" that are not excluded by the terms of Paragraph **D**.

If aggregate insured losses attributable to terrorist acts certified under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act exceed \$100 billion in a calendar year and we have met our insurer deductible under the Terrorism Risk Insurance Act, we shall not be liable for the payment of any portion of the amount of such losses that exceeds \$100 billion, and in such case insured losses up to that amount are subject to pro rata allocation in accordance with procedures established by the Secretary of the Treasury.

- **A.** Paragraph **A.** applies unless Endorsement **CU 27 00** is attached to the Policy. If Endorsement **CU 27 00** is attached to the Policy, only Paragraph **B.** applies.
 - 1. Paragraph 1.c. under Section I Coverage A -Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability is replaced by the following:
 - c. This insurance applies to "bodily injury" and "property damage" caused by an "occurrence" that takes place in the "coverage territory" only if:
 - (1) The "bodily injury" or "property damage":
 - (a) Occurs on the premises shown in the Schedule or the grounds and structures appurtenant to those premises; or
 - (b) Arises out of the project or operation at the premises shown in the Schedule and related to your insured business located at the premises shown in the Schedule;
 - (2) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurs during the policy period; and

- (3) Prior to the policy period, no insured listed under Paragraph 1.a. of Section II -Who Is An Insured and no "employee" authorized by you to give or receive notice of an "occurrence" or claim, knew that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" had occurred, in whole or in part. If such a listed insured or authorized "employee" knew, prior to the policy period, that the "bodily injury" or "property damage" occurred, then any continuation, change or resumption of such "bodily injury" or "property damage" during or after the policy period will be deemed to have been known prior to the policy period.
- 2. Paragraph 1.c. under Section I Coverage B -Personal And Advertising Injury Liability is replaced by the following:
 - **c.** This insurance applies to "personal and advertising injury" caused by an offense committed in the "coverage territory" but only if:
 - (1) The offense arises out of your business:
 - (a) Performed on the premises shown in the Schedule; or

- (b) In connection with the project or operation at the premises shown in the Schedule and related to your insured business located at the premises shown in the Schedule; and
- (2) The offense was committed during the policy period.

However, with respect to Paragraph **1.c.(1)(a)** of this Insuring Agreement, if the "personal and advertising injury" is caused by:

- (1) False arrest, detention or imprisonment; or
- (2) The wrongful eviction from, wrongful entry into, or invasion of the right of private occupancy of a room, dwelling or premises that a person occupies, committed by or on behalf of its owner, landlord or lessor;

then such offense must arise out of your business performed on the premises shown in the Schedule and the offense must have been committed on the premises shown in the Schedule or the grounds and structures appurtenant to those premises.

- **B.** If Endorsement **CU 27 00** is attached to the Policy, Paragraphs **A.** and **B.** of Endorsement **CU 27 00** are replaced by the following:
 - A. Paragraphs 1.c., 1.d., 1.e. and 1.f. of Section I -Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability are replaced by the following:
 - c. This insurance applies to "bodily injury" and "property damage" caused by an "occurrence" that takes place in the "coverage territory" only if:
 - (1) The "bodily injury" or "property damage":
 - (a) Occurs on the premises shown in the Schedule or the grounds and structures appurtenant to those premises; or
 - (b) Arises out of the project or operation at the premises shown in the Schedule and related to your insured business located at the premises shown in the Schedule;
 - (2) The "bodily injury" or "property damage" did not occur before the Retroactive Date, if any, shown in the Declarations of the "underlying insurance" or after the end of the policy period; and

- (3) A claim for damages because of the "bodily injury" or "property damage" is first made against any insured, in accordance with Paragraph **1.d.** of this Insuring Agreement, during the policy period or any Extended Reporting Period we provide under Extended Reporting Periods.
- **d.** A claim by a person or organization seeking damages will be deemed to have been made at the earlier of the following times:
 - (1) When notice of such claim is received and recorded by any insured or by the "underlying insurer" or us if the limits of the "underlying insurance" have been used up, whichever comes first; or
 - (2) When we make settlement in accordance with Paragraph **1.a.** of this Insuring Agreement, or settlement is made by the "underlying insurer" with our agreement.
- e. All claims for damages because of "bodily injury" to the same person, including damages claimed by any person or organization for care, loss of services, or death resulting at any time from the "bodily injury", will be deemed to have been made at the time the first of those claims is made against any insured.
- f. All claims for damages because of "property damage" causing loss to the same person or organization will be deemed to have been made at the time the first of those claims is made against any insured.
- B. Paragraph 1.c. of Section I Coverage B -Personal And Advertising Injury Liability is replaced by the following:
 - c. This insurance applies to "personal and advertising injury" caused by an offense committed in the "coverage territory" but only if:
 - (1) The offense arises out of your business:
 - (a) Performed on the premises shown in the Schedule; or
 - (b) In connection with the project or operation at the premises shown in the Schedule and related to your insured business located at the premises shown in the Schedule;
 - (2) The offense was not committed before the Retroactive Date, if any, shown in the Declarations of the "underlying insurance" or after the end of the policy period; and

(3) A claim for damages because of the "personal and advertising injury" is first made against any insured, in accordance with Paragraph **1.d.** of this Insuring Agreement, during the policy period or any Extended Reporting Period we provide under Extended Reporting Periods. However, with respect to Paragraph **1.c.(1)(a)** of this Insuring Agreement, if the "personal and advertising injury" is caused by:

- (1) False arrest, detention or imprisonment; or
- (2) The wrongful eviction from, wrongful entry into, or invasion of the right of private occupancy of a room, dwelling or premises that a person occupies, committed by or on behalf of its owner, landlord or lessor;

then such offense must arise out of your business performed on the premises shown in the Schedule and the offense must have been committed on the premises shown in the Schedule or the grounds and structures appurtenant to those premises.

THIS ENDORSEMENT CHANGES THE POLICY. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY. **ABUSE OR MOLESTATION EXCLUSION**

This endorsement modifies insurance provided under the following:

COMMERCIAL LIABILITY UMBRELLA COVERAGE PART

The following exclusion is added to Paragraph 2., Exclusions of Section I - Coverage A - Bodily Injury And Property Damage Liability and Paragraph 2., Exclusions of Section I - Coverage B - Personal And Advertising Injury Liability:

This insurance does not apply to "bodily injury", "property damage" or "personal and advertising injury" arising out of:

1. The actual or threatened abuse or molestation by anyone of any person while in the care, custody or control of any insured, or

- 2. The negligent:
 - a. Employment;
 - **b.** Investigation;
 - c. Supervision;
 - **d.** Reporting to the proper authorities, or failure to so report; or
 - e. Retention;

of a person for whom any insured is or ever was legally responsible and whose conduct would be excluded by Paragraph **1.** above.



ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

Applicable only if this policy is issued by the Truck Insurance Exchange, Farmers Insurance Exchange or Fire Insurance Exchange.

RECIPROCAL PROVISIONS

As used in these provisions the term "Underwriters Associations" means the Truck Underwriters Association, the Farmers Underwriters Association or the Fire Underwriters Association respectively, attorney-in-fact for the Insurance Exchange issuing the policy.

This policy is made and issued in consideration of your premium payment to us. It is also issued in consideration of the information you gave to us during the application process, some of which is set out in the policy Declarations, and in consideration of the Subscription Agreement, which is provided to you and is incorporated herein by reference. You acknowledge that you have read, understood and agree to all the terms and conditions of the Subscription Agreement. Among other things, the Subscription Agreement appoints your Attorney-in-Fact, authorizes your Attorney-in-Fact to execute interinsurance policies between you and other subscribers and to perform various functions, and addresses compensation of the Attorney-in-Fact.

Nothing in this policy is intended, or shall be construed, to create either:

- A partnership or mutual insurance association, or
- b. Any joint liability.

We may sue or be sued in our own name, as though we were an individual, if necessary to enforce any claims which arise under this policy. In any suit against us, service of process shall be upon the Underwriters Association, Attorney-in-Fact. Membership fees which you pay are not part of the premium. They are fully earned when you are granted membership and coverage is effective. They are not returnable. However, they may be applied as a credit to membership fees required of you for other insurance which we agree to write.

We hold the Annual Meeting of the members of the Truck Insµrance Exchange at our Home Office at Los Angeles, California, on the first Tuesday following the first Monday following the 15 day of March of each year at 1:00 p.m. If this policy is issued by the Farmers Insurance Exchange such meeting is held at the same place on the first Monday following the 15 of March of each year at 2:00 P.M. If this policy is issued by the Fire Insurance Exchange such meeting is held at the same place on the first Monday following the 15" of March each year at 10:00 a.m. The Board of Governors may elect to change the time and place of the meeting. If they do so, you will be mailed a written or printed notice at your last known address at least ten days before such a time. Otherwise, no notice will be sent to you.

The Board of Governors shall be chosen by subscribers from among yourselves. This will take place at the Annual Meeting or at any special meeting which is held for that purpose. The Board of Governors shall have full power and authority to establish such rules and regulations for our management as are not inconsistent with the subscribers' agreements.

Your premium for this policy and all payment made for its continuance shall be payable to us at our Home Office or such location named by us in your premium notice. The funds which you pay shall be placed to your credit on our records. They will be applied to the payment of your proportion of losses and expenses and to the establishment of reserves and general surplus. The Board of Governors or its Executive Committee has the authority to deposit, withdraw, invest and reinvest such funds. You agree that any amount which the Board of Governors allocates to our surplus fund may be retained by us. Also, after provision is made for all of our liabilities, it may be applied to any purpose deemed proper and advantageous to you and other policyholders.

This policy is nonassessable.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

(Applicable only if this policy is issued by Mid-Century Insurance Company.) Policy fees which you pay are not part of the premium. They are fully earned when the policy is issued. They are not returnable. However, they may be applied as a credit to policy fees required of you for other insurance which we agree to write.

This policy shall not be effective unless countersigned on the Declarations page by a duly authorized representative of the Company named on Declarations Page.
